Congratulations to the staff at the Tucson T&SC and the attendees at the recent Autumn Satellite Grand American. The shoot ended up with an increase in attendance over last year's tournament. Maybe this is the prelude to normalized trapshooting activity for 2021.

The folks at Kolar Arms will be providing another beautiful trap combo for this year's Gun Club Fund Raffle item. Proceeds from the ticket sales will go to several gun clubs that apply to the ATA by July 1. The gun? Well, that could go to YOU! You can get six tickets for the price of five this year, so find your ATA Delegate or secretary or contact the ATA office to order your tickets.

How about an ATA/TRAP & FIELD official 2021 wall calendar? Twelve full-color historic TRAP & FIELD cover photos will be featured along with the shoot dates and locations for the Grand American and all Satellite Grand Americans. It will be one of a kind and will soon be a collector's item. Cost is only \$10 plus \$5 for postage and handling in the U.S. This exclusive calendar will be available late December and early January depending on your mailing area. Contact the ATA office to place your order.

Your local ATA gun club has been provided with five complimentary ATA and AIM 2021 memberships. If you know of someone at your club that might be able to make use of these, ask the staff if they are still available. We need every new member we can get!

In just a few weeks, we will be unveiling a new reservation system for camping during the AIM Championships and the Grand American. "CAMSPOT" is an online reservation system in which you can select and submit payment for your campsite via the internet. The website will show which sites are reserved and which ones are still available so you can make a selection. As reservations come in, we will be posting the names on the reserved sites in alphabetical and numerical order to the ATA website each week. This will help you see where other members will be located during the Grand. For those who may want to continue to make reservations over the phone or mail, Julie will still take those, but she will do so by accessing the reservation system the same way members are able to do.

The Secretaries Toolbox got put on the back burner during the Grand so our web developers could work on the remote registration application for the Grand. They got back to work on it soon after the Grand, and we're about ready to launch. Secretaries will be able to register and cancel their own shoot dates, they will be able to generate e-mails to members in their states and provinces, and check on unpaid memberships. Once registered or canceled, the shoot dates will immediately be shown on the ATA website.

The ATA has partnered with AUGEO to offer discounts to members on a wide variety of goods and services, including many types of insurance. We will be sending e-mails to ATA members on behalf of AUGEO in the next few weeks with more information on this value-added benefit to ATA membership.

Thanks go out again for the sacrifices and dedication of time and resources to keep targets in the air at the hundreds of ATA gun clubs worldwide. The officials and members that continue to face and overcome the challenges that this pandemic has caused deserve your thanks also.

All-Around Average

Award winners for 2020

Shooters in good standing with the ATA are eligible for a TRAP & FIELD All-Around Average Award. Target requirements for the 2020 target year only were as follows:

open (five awards)—2,000 singles, 1,500 handicap and 1,000 doubles

Lady I, Lady II, junior, junior gold and veteran (two awards in each category)—2,000 singles, 1,200 handicap and 700 doubles

sub-vet (two awards)—2,000 singles, 1,500 handicap and 1,000 doubles

sub-junior and senior vet (two awards in each category)—1,500 singles, 700 handicap and 500 doubles

Candidates for the T&F awards must also have completed the 400 all-around targets (championship singles, handicap and doubles) in All-American Qualifying Shoots in a minimum of three states or provinces. All-American Qualifying Shoots are the Grand American, Satellite Grands, ATA Zone tournaments, state and provincial shoots, plus any other shoots where entries from the singles, handicap and doubles championship events (or any combination thereof) total at least 450.

While declaring category at tournament classification is optional, to be considered for

a category T&F All-Around Average Award, candidates must declare the category for at least a portion of their All-American qualifying shoots attended.

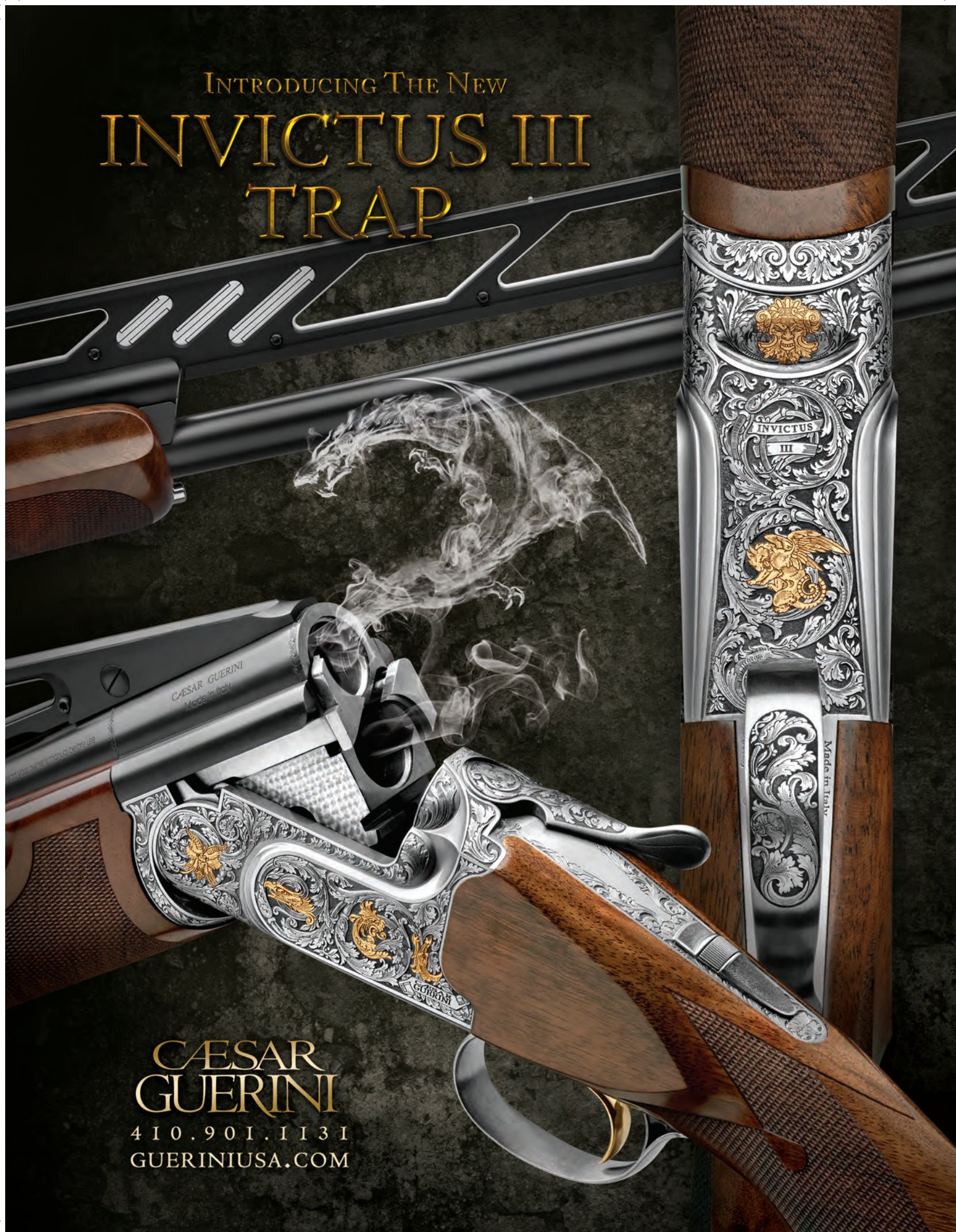
Travis Dann and Todd Hosbach were elected as ATA Alternate Delegates at the state shoot in July. I remain as Delegate.

The board also voted to award the high composite average per category. For example, three to seven shooters equals one award and eight to 14 shooters equals two awards:

Open—Matt Smelser, .8706. *Ladies'*—Mikayla Dickson, .9248. *Sub-junior*—Zachary Emmons, .9209. *Junior*—Brayden Morris, .9369; Hunter Morton, .9315. *Junior gold*—Taylor Bolin, .9123. *Sub-vet*—Barry Allen, .9220; Steve Rice, .9082. *Veteran*—William Cook, .9057. *Senior vet*—Herman Chandley, .8728.

Loveless, Swinea, Honnold, Sharp and Emmons earned spots on All-American teams in addition to Emma Grace Mathews, .9172; Brooke Barnett, .9158; and Lucas Davis, .9077. All will be recognized as well as receive an award.

Also this target year, two shooters reached quite a goal. Tyler Honnold made AA-27-AA, and George Reese Sr. registered his 500,000th ATA target. Congratulations to all of the above shooters.

I'm excited that we are now in the 2021 trap season. Many clubs are hosting ATA shoots. Camden, Jacksonville SC, Black River and Hot Springs have all reported good turnouts despite COVID-19. Most of us are planning trips for the current 2021 season; don't forget to add the Arkansas State Shoot dates to your list: June 22-27 at the Jacksonville SC.

If you run into Shannon Adcock, give him a big thank you for his hard work on the ASTF's new website arkansasatrashooting.com. Be sure to check it out.

I ran into a few of our state's new 2021 ATA All-Americans and asked them if they would share their experience of making the team. As you read through their stories, you will see that you have to find what works for you. You never stop learning, and take time to listen to some of the "old" guys/gals; they can tell you some amazing stories.

Braydon Smith: I started shooting mid 2017 at an Arkansas Game and Fish facility. They held a "Learn How to Shoot Trap" clinic, and I have loved shooting ever since. My favorite place to shoot is in Arizona at Tucson T&SC. The advice I would share with a new shooter would be to keep your head up no matter what. Trap is a mental game, and getting angry doesn't help. If you aren't winning, you are learning! I do have a shooting routine. I try to picture myself hitting the targets, and a few minutes before I go to the line, I try to put myself in the best mindset to come away with a good score. It's been quite an endeavor this year, that's for sure! I have met a lot of great people and traveled to some awesome places while making lifetime memories. I couldn't have accomplished any of this without the support of my parents and the many people in my life who have made my All-American journey a success.

Logan Applegate: I started shooting with the Arkansas Youth Shooting Sports Program (AYSSP) when I was in the sixth grade. My favorite places to shoot are the Southern Grand and Florida State Shoot, but Arkansas is a close second. The best advice I ever received was from Doyle Gaskin, Jacksonville. He said to shoot at as many different places as you can because everything is just a little different: the background, weather, color of clay targets, and even the way tournaments are run. I really don't have any routine before a shoot, but Dad says I do have a routine, and it goes like this: I usually wait in the air-conditioned car with the radio on, parked somewhat far away under some type of shade, watching YouTube videos, drinking an ice-cold drink and eating some type of delicious snack, while my dad waits in the blistering heat under the burning rays from the sun for my turn to shoot. When it's about time for me to start getting things ready (the gun, the right choke, the right ammo, the ammo bag and shell holder), I will have my dad tell me about 10 to 15 times that I need to get ready, and I will almost always "forget" something, so my dad will have to walk (sometimes run) to the car in the blistering heat. Also, Dad will have to do this multiple times . . . I usually do this until Dad has a minor heat stroke. Then I go and shoot.

For this year our goal was to visit most of our family who live in different states and spend as much time as we could with them, while having fun competing. Any extra info that I could add would be to take every practice, tournament and even every missed bird as a learning experience, while having fun. By the way, Dad said, "Getting a teenager to answer these questions was by far the hardest part of this season."

Katie Pryor: I started shooting in sixth grade. My favorite place to shoot is the Nebraska Trapshooting Association in Doniphan. My advice is to be patient, and there is no crying in trapshooting. My routine for when I shoot is counting my breaths; it keeps me calm and focused. My journey to working for the All-American team began as soon as quarantine lifted enough for us to travel. I went to any tournament I could hit. Over the summer I was home for a total of 12 days; the rest of the time, I was shooting, going to a shoot, or headed home from a shoot.

Robert Luke Yagos: I started shooting trap for the Cabot team when I was 13 while attending Cabot Junior High South. My favorite place to shoot trap is the Jacksonville SC. I enjoy the nice facility, but mainly it's about the staff. I practice there a lot! Mr. Doyle Gaskin works there and has been my mentor since Day 1. I have the utmost respect for him. Everything he says, I try to retain. His daughter once said, "If you can remember just what this man has forgotten, you will be in good shape." When you're new to shooting trap, you have to be patient with yourself. Learn the basics and get comfortable with the rules, then *practice, practice, practice!* Be early and prepared! Mrs. Kim Hill and Stephen Bitely have been great coaches. I have enjoyed all the teams I have shot with and places we have traveled.

Kayla Workman: I started shooting in 2017, my seventh grade year of middle school. One of my favorite places to shoot is Tucson, AZ—there is the most beautiful view of the mountains from the trapfields. My advice to new shooters would be to set a goal for yourself, whether it be hitting 10 straight or 100 straight, and strive to reach that goal, regardless of how long it takes to achieve it. Many people know me by the dance I do when I shoot (some call it the "Kayla Shuffle"), but it keeps me loose and focused. I started shooting in the local AYSSP and in small tournaments around Arkansas and then decided I wanted to go further, so I set a goal of making the Arkansas state team with the help of my mentor/coaches Doyle Gaskin and Steve Mathis. After I was able to achieve that goal, I decided I wanted to go one more step to All-American. So I practiced and traveled to many shoots, such as the Grand American and the Satellite Grand in Tucson, and with some decent scores and serious support from many people, I was able to place ninth in Lady I.

We have some pretty awesome young shooters in our state. Congratulations to these young men and women and the rest of Arkansas' All-Americans once again. Keep up the good work; Arkansas is proud to you!

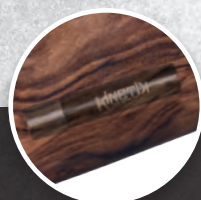

2020 Southwestern Grand

The 33,000+-acre NRA Whittington Center is located close to the Colorado-New Mexico border at Raton. The Whittington Center is nestled on flat land at the end of the Great Plains and is only a long rifle shot from the picturesque Sangre de Cristo Mountains. At first glance, the Whittington Center appears to be on unused land that man and time has passed over. But one doesn't have to look very hard to see just how rich and colorful this land's history is. It has been in constant use since the beginning of man in North America.

For thousands of years, the Pueblo and Apache Indians hunted on this very land. Then for hundreds of years, wagon trains heading west and mule trains driven by muleskinners hauling freight all hunted this land as they followed the Santa Fe Trail south. Then in the late 1800s, a large rich vein of coal, along with a small amount of gold, was discovered on this

land. For the next 40-some years, a town of over 1,200 miners plus their families worked for the local mine and called this land home. It is said that most of the miners spent a great deal of their spare time hunting in the nearby mountains to help feed their families. After the mine played out, a few ranchers worked and hunted this land until the NRA acquired it and opened the NRA Whittington Center to the public in 1973.

Given the long history of working, living and hunting on this land, one would expect the large game animals to either be nonexistent or extremely scarce. I'm happy to say this is not true, for my wife Joyce and I were scarcely through the main gate when we started to encounter small herds of deer and antelope. As we moved deeper into the shooting complex, we started to encounter larger herds of both. Later in the week we stopped and watched as a herd of 30 to 40 elk passed within 75 yards of us, moving steadily but unhurried across the land.

Home, home on the range, where the deer and the antelope play. I know this song wasn't written about the NRA Whittington Center, but it surely could have been. With its cool, clear mountain mornings, warm cloudless summer afternoons, beautiful fiery orange sunsets, along with over 15 shooting ranges, the Whittington Center is truly a shooter's dream come true. Did I mention the Southwestern Grand was held at the Whittington Center this year? It was, and it was a good one. The shoot wasn't large as Grands go. I'm sure COVID-19 had something to do with that. During the 2020 target year ending Aug. 31, Oklahoma threw a lot of targets in spite of the pandemic: OTSA, 256,425; Oil Capital, 43,800; Shawnee, 19,950; Bartlesville, 17,550; Ada, 15,950; Tulsa, 9,250; Red Dirt, 6,100; Cimarron, 5,800; Hennessey, 2,900 (first shoot only); Alfalfa County, 2,000.

Steve Blackburn and Randy and Vickie Farmer had their hands full Oct. 22-24. They threw 400 rounds of trap and skeet targets for Eastern Oklahoma State College and Connors State College. The two accounted for

304 rounds and 96 rounds. They finished at approximately 8 p.m. with car headlights lighting one of their unlit fields. Then on Saturday they were right back for their Oct. 24 Big 50 shoot. Dakota Sliger won the singles and the handicap. Alan Julian from Texas won the doubles.

Finally—the off again, on again Arizona State Shoot at Ben Avery concluded on Nov. 1. Weather was super—warm, but not too hot. Perfect for wearing shorts, and the breezes were light, except maybe for Sunday when the winds were a little swirly. If the Arizona Department of Tourism cooked up five days for shooting, they could not have done much better. There were 306 competitors from 32 states and provinces, including one from Puerto Rico (that's kind of an inside joke), with Arizona leading the pack. The next-largest contingents were from Colorado, California, Oklahoma, Iowa, Wyoming, Minnesota and Texas. The three championship events totaled 503, giving us a Competition Factor of 3, not bad in the age of COVID.

Our shoot managers, 2 Lazy 2, did a terrific job, and they were thrown a curveball right off the bat. The gals ended up working until 12:30

a.m. on Tuesday integrating the PreSquad information left over from March into the 3S program format, no easy task, and the results were almost flawless. Many thanks also to Mark Williams and Steve Bell. They were everywhere, keeping things moving along.

Sunday morning, prior to shooting, we held our long-delayed 2020 annual meeting. The election of zone directors and a new Executive Board was postponed until this coming March; however, ATA rules required a Delegate election, and John Bergman will remain in office. Tiger Volz agreed to serve once more as Alternate Delegate. There was also a prolonged discussion about the condition of equipment at Ben Avery. A general consensus was taken, and it was decided that the board would draft a letter to Game and Fish officials, and a contingent would attend the next Commission meeting to discuss problems.

What happened—there are three separate stories that highlighted our state shoot. They could be titled *Gerald Meyer Conquers All or The Revenge of the Old Guys*, *The Infamous Dalton Gang Infiltrates Arizona*, and *Karen B. Goes to Work*.

Gerald Meyer, at age 83, is our new state singles champion, and he did it in style, posting a 198 and then besting Don Williamson in a shootoff. But that's not all. Gerald also shot a 100 straight in the Golden Barrel Singles, won the short-yardage division in the Agave Handicap, topped all senior vets in the Ocotillo Handicap, and then won Class D in the Jumping Cholla Doubles. Wow! I am exhausted just writing about it.

The Dalton Gang struck fear in all in the Old West, and a slightly updated version out of the hinterlands of New Mexico has been doing just that to fellow trapshooters for some time. However, we finally got a break: Britt Dalton has moved to Phoenix for pilot training, and he made sure we knew that he was here. Not wasting any time, Britt started by winning AA with a 99 in the first event, the Saguaro Singles, topped only by Darvin Thomas' 100. He then won AA in the Jumping Cholla Doubles, where Tim Robb was high gun with 98. Britt took Class AA again in the class doubles, beating Tim in carryover. Steve Stella was overall high at 99. Next up was the Golden Barrel Singles, and Britt won AA once more; however, the event did produce three 100 straights, all in senior vet. Meyer, Joe Henderson and Gerry Williams did the trick, with Gerry emerging on top via carryover. Britt then won AA again in the Prickly Pear Doubles, but he was overshadowed by Ken Mlynarz, who ran them all. Britt proceeded to lay low for a little while, no doubt hiding in a gulch, while a red-hot Ken M. shot his second 100 in a row during the Singles Class Championship. Gerry Williams, Darvin Thomas and Mark Matthews also went 100 straight, winning senior vet, veteran and sub-vet, respectively. Interspersed was the Preliminary Handicap, and junior gold and ASU student Robert Will Pike was high gun with a well-earned 97. Will proved that this was no fluke, shooting a 96 in the Handicap Championship and earning 1.5 yards during the shoot.

But now back to Britt. He won AA in the Singles Championship, and then it was on to the doubles, where he was high gun, shooting a fine 97 on a day with ever-changing winds. He also is the new Arizona handicap champion, besting 163 others. He won the all-around title by eight birds and the HOA by nine. New Mexico's loss is our gain.

Karen Bergman had an amazing run. Even though the Lady II category has thinned out, every event that Karen entered, she either won or was in a shootoff. Starting with the Agave Handicap, Karen tied for high in 22-24 but lost out to Jennifer Liljeros. Next was the Jumping Cholla Doubles—win. Then came the class doubles—win, followed by the Golden Barrel Singles—win, and the class singles—win. In the Preliminary Handicap she tied for Lady II with Jennifer once more but lost the shootoff. She then came back and won the Singles, Doubles and Handicap Championships plus the all-around and HOA Lady II titles and even dragged her husband over the finish line to win the husband-wife trophy.

Some new names popped up: Allisen Reese in Lady I; Jennifer Liljeros, a most welcome

refugee from California, in Lady II; the Pizinger boys, Nathaniel and Wyatt in junior and sub-junior. Wyatt won the Steve Williams Buckle as high sub-junior in the championship events; Greg Spiczka, a former Rookie of the Year, who took time off from coaching junior shooters to win four trophies; Isabella Ricci, a junior lady shooter who posted some great scores and showed the boys just who was boss; Brett Hardesty, another junior; and Austin Swayzee in sub-junior. Austin shot his first 50 straight during the state tournament.

The old guard, including Tim Robb, Richard Goerlich, Vince Bianco, Gerry Williams, Greg Holden, Ron Schroer, Joe Henderson and such new faces as Steve Stella, also made their presence felt.

When things were wrapping up, many out-of-state shooters stopped by and thanked ASTA board members for, in their words, a most enjoyable shoot. That was music to our ears.

Around the state: Casa Grande, now in the top 15 clubs in the country in number of targets thrown (must be something about green), held their usual Monday Big 50 on Oct. 12, and Robert Will Pike and Ron Schroer led the way with 50 straight in the opening singles. The same duo topped all in the following handicap with 49s, and they were at it again in the doubles with Ron high at 47 and Will right on his tail with 46. Believe it or not, there were a number of other shooters.

Tucson had their Harvest Festival Oct. 17-18, and topping the field in the Leadoff Singles was Gerry Williams with 100. Ken Mlynarz and Lloyd Koty were right behind. Helen Kisthardt was high lady. There were then 16 doubles competitors, and two familiar names came to the fore; Copsey and Jay Alderman topped all with 98s. Next is the Spring Grand American Feb. 15-21. Do not miss it!



SUCCESS ON THE LINE

Teaching the new shooter

One thing we probably all remember about the early days of our shooting careers is how and who we learned to shoot from. Something else that we often remember are the things that we wish we had done differently, that would have pushed our game for the better much more quickly.

For me, it was refusing to listen to my dad and closing my right eye, even though I had the ability to keep both eyes open. Once I did this, my scores instantly got better, but when you are 14, listening to your dad (who has had more good scores than I may ever have) is not always top priority. This is why when we teach a new shooter, we have to give him or her the opportunity to excel from the beginning, and not make the same mistakes that we made. This is also key to shooter retention, which is important for our sport now more than it ever has been.

Something that many people do not know about me is that I have a master's degree in instructional leadership (education). Not only did this help me become a more effective teacher in the classroom, but it has also helped me a great deal in giving clinics, especially when it comes to teaching new shooters.

The most important aspect of the sport that you must get across to a new shooter is safety. Small items that seem commonplace to the experienced shooter may not be to someone who is not familiar with firearms. We may take for granted actions such as making sure the gun is open when you pick it up off of the rack and keeping it open all of the time, never loading it until you are on the field, keeping the gun pointed downrange, and loading only one shell at a time (except for doubles) are all items that are very much worth mentioning to a beginning shooter. I suggest making a new shooter pamphlet which includes tips on how to play our sport, as well as a list of rules for your club to give to beginners or once-in-a-while shooters to not only keep your club a safe environment, but to make new shooters

feel more welcome at your club. Safety is probably the most important thing that you can impart to the new shooter.

Moving on: when you help a beginner, try not to overcomplicate the experience. You shouldn't overwhelm them with technical terms and jargon; just keep it simple. One of the best ways to describe hitting a target is "just get a little bit in front of it and put the gun up alongside the target" or "put the gun in the way of the target." These are easy for a new shooter to understand, and at the same time are accurate statements which help them understand how to hit a target. My grandfather liked to use the analogy that your dog is running across the yard and you want to spray the dog with the garden hose and get him wet. If you do not spray the hose out in front of the dog a little bit, the dog isn't going to get a bath. When you put something complicated into a simple idea like that, it can go a long way to getting new shooters breaking targets.

Also, it's important to compliment the novice shooter for what is done right.

When I teach new shooters, I always begin with a short classroom session before we head outside. In the classroom I explain the basics of the sport (as well as safety), but as simply as possible to avoid overwhelming my students. I will help them determine their eye-dominance and teach them how to stand, mount the gun, etc. One thing I learned in the education field is that you never want to dwell on a topic for too long. The average adult attention span is around 20 minutes, so if you drag the classroom on for too long, the effectiveness of your teaching will begin to decrease. I will also go over hold points and look points, but briefly, as it is best to reiterate most of these topics again when everyone is outside on the trapline.

When I teach a brand-new shooter, after a little bit of classroom, I will set the machine on a straightaway from the 16-yard line. This gets new shooters to understand that they have to move upward to the target in order to hit it, and

to not simply shoot the gun in the direction of the target. After they have gotten to the point that they can hit more than about half, we will move to stations 2 and 4. This makes the target a little bit of an angle, but not too much. This teaches the novices how to lead a target.

Once they get the hang of stations 2 and 4, I will move them to 1 and 5, again with the target still locked as a straightaway from position 3. This gives them an angle of decent depth, but again not a full hard angle. I prefer to have the students alternate between each other rather than in a traditional squad format so that I can better address both questions and safety, as well as providing each shooter with more individual feedback between shots. The most important feedback that you can give a student is why they missed so that they can learn from their mistakes, and in the future, they can be able to self-diagnose why they miss.

After a box of shells or so, I will almost always have the class shoot at least a round or two in a traditional squad format with the trap reset to its normal oscillation. This way I can teach them to be comfortable and functional in a traditional squad setting, so when they shoot outside of the class, they will be able to keep up, and most importantly, be safe and have a good time. I try not to have a beginner class shoot too much, however, as they really do not have the "shooting muscles" that we have. After a while of being fatigued, the amount learned will decrease. Four or five boxes of shells in about a two-hour span is really about all that most individuals can handle at this point in their shooting career, both physically and mentally.

In closing, make every effort that you can to help out new shooters when they show up at your club. Our sport needs new members now more than ever. Be sure to point out what they are doing right and give a compliment and some praise. Be friendly, give them a little guidance, and most importantly, give them the desire to come back and keep our sport alive.

ON THE OTHER SIDE OF 70

One eye or two?

I'd like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a very safe and happy New Year. Let's hope that 2021 sees the end of Covid-19 and that we can get back to a normal life.

One of the oldest ongoing debates among trapshooters is centered on the decision to shoot with one eye or two. (There have been days when my squadmates thought that I may have closed both eyes—but that's a different story.) There seems to be a consensus that shooting with both eyes is the better way to go, but this is not always possible.

If you have no choice

Of the reasons for shooting with one eye, the most obvious is having sight in only one eye. Whatever the cause, this is a situation that requires one to learn to shoot with one eye if he or she is going to shoot at all. The choice is in how to go about it.

Let's suppose that an individual is right-handed and has lost sight in his/her right eye. There are two approaches to this situation: 1) learn to shoot left-handed, or 2) alter the gun to allow shooting right-handed while using the left eye. Of these two choices, I much prefer having the shooter switch sides and shoot from the opposite shoulder. Here's why:

It's easier. No, I'm not joking. Anyone I have known who switched shoulders for whatever reason was shooting passable scores after 500 targets and was becoming competitive after 1,000. Shooting from the opposite shoulder will feel unnatural at first, but you will soon become accustomed to it.

Of course, altering the gun can be done, but it requires a lot more expense and effort. Building an offset stock (sometimes called a "cripple" stock) requires a great deal of time and effort on the part of a very skilled stockmaker. Offset ribs have been used with some success, but they bring their own unique problems: they are tricky to set up and easily knocked out of adjustment. Also, even though I said in my October article that canting the gun has minimal effect, using an offset rib will really cause a shift in point of impact.

Cross-dominance

Cross-dominance is a situation where the dominant hand and dominant eye are on opposite sides (i.e., right-handed but left-eye dominant or vice versa). Occasionally, a new shooter will experience "mystery misses" where the gun looked to be lined up properly, but the target sailed on unscathed. This can happen when the beginning shooter unknowingly lined up the shot using the wrong eye.

A new shooter should check for eye dominance at the very beginning of learning to shoot. It's really simple and can save hours of aggravation. All you need to do is pick out an object a few yards away and, with both eyes open, raise your hand and point at the object. Do not be slow and deliberate, just raise your hand and point. Now close one eye. If your finger is still pointed at the object, that is your

master eye. If you find that your finger is pointed to the side of the object, the eye that you closed is your master eye.

If you are just beginning and find that you are cross-dominant, I once again feel that you should learn to shoot with your master eye aligned with the rib. Since you are just starting, shooting is going to feel awkward from either side, and you will eliminate some problems down the road.

For those who have been shooting for some time (perhaps by closing one eye) and do not wish to change sides, there are several solutions, depending upon the individual. For some shooters, the only solution is to prevent the off eye from seeing anything, either by completely taping over the lens of the shooting glasses or by closing one eye. This method will require you to hold a lower gun so that the barrel does not hide the target as it leaves the traphouse.

Others may be all right with a spot or a strip of translucent tape on the upper portion of the lens. Still others will be able to use a sight blinder along the side of the rib to prevent the off eye from seeing the front bead.

What about seniors?

It is not out of the question for eye dominance to change, or even switch back and forth as we get older. Have you ever gotten to the end of a long, tiring day and gone out for a shootoff when your eyes are tired, only to discover that you have a severe case of "CHS"? A shift in eye dominance could be the reason.

Why not try a sight blinder or some other cross-fire preventer? Put it on and get used to it, then it will be there if you need it. What's it gonna hurt? Also, check your eye dominance occasionally, especially if you find yourself experiencing those mystery misses.

In addition, recipients must be on the 27-yard line at the end of the target season.

Pins are awarded on a one-time basis. The awards are generated by the ATA office at the end of each target year; shooters do not have to initiate the action in order to receive a pin.

On opening day of the 2020 Grand American, held at Missouri TA, Linn Creek, 15-year-old Aidan Master broke 99 and 25 in shootoff to win the TRAP & FIELD Handicap. Jack Knaus, 17, and Foster Bartholow headed the Hodgdon Powder Singles and Little Egypt Golf Cars Doubles after 100s.

Hodgdon Powder Singles

Twenty-one shooters posted perfect centuries in the Grand's first event, and Knaus needed 175 in carryover to claim the top prize over runnerup Sean Hawley, who broke 174. Landing the third-place spot was Zachari Nanini. Knaus went on to run all the 16-yard targets during Prelim Week, winning the Super 400 event and claiming junior titles on Thursday and Friday. Hawley placed third in the Super 400 and was AAA winner on prelim Thursday with another century.

Denis L. Bringelson earned the AAA title with 100, while Chase Horton and Donald Schaffer Jr. were second and third, also with perfect scores. Drew Fryman and Brad Nagel placed one-two in AA for their 100s. Bringelson's other singles trophies from the tournament included AAA fourth after a 200 in the Clay Target Championship.

Cole Henning headed sub-junior ranks after his century, his career first. He broke another the next day and ended with age-group third place.

All three trophies in junior and junior gold were earned with perfect scores. Reece

Holmes, Luke Yagos and Mitchell Germany placed first, second and third in 15-17 standings. Yagos also won junior titles in the NRA Singles and class 16s with perfect scores. His 200 on Monday was his first.

Junior gold winners on Prelim Wednesday included James Malin, champion; Chase Cunningham, runnerup; and Patrick Hopson, third. In addition to a trophy in the Singles Class Championship, Hopson took open runnerup in the Champion of Champions.

Ronald Wolf and David Bessine were veteran winner and runnerup with 100s. Wolf was also veteran champ in the Super 400.

Raylee Bishop topped Class A after 99, and Jacob Eichelberger was B winner, also with a near-perfect score. Bob Carver garnered top C honors with 98. Lee Perry's 99 earned him the D title. He landed Class D awards in five other singles events, including the title in the Super 400.

Stacy Rehor and Sandra Jo Jack captured the Lady I and Lady II crowns with 99s, while Ray Stafford was senior vet winner with a near-perfect tally. Rehor was champion over the field on Prelim Thursday and secured three other category singles trophies during Prelim Week. Jack won the same prize last year and was category runnerup in 2018. She bagged a total of eight Lady II singles awards during the Grand. Stafford was senior vet singles champ in five other events.

Ziggy Tkaczenko broke 91 to win the chair trophy, and he went on to collect a total of six singles awards. He claimed the category titles

in the day's other two events as well, winning the handicap with 82 and the doubles with 83. In all, he racked up four handicap and six doubles prizes.

TRAP & FIELD Handicap

Aidan Master and Michael Gooch posted the lone 99s in the day's handicap. In the shootoff, Master ran all 25, while Gooch hit 23 to take the runnerup prize. Master went on to break 98 in the Challenger Ammunition Handicap during Grand Week and prevailed in a four-round shootoff to claim high-gun honors in that event as well. He earned four yards during the tournament, moving from 20.5 to 24.5.

Chanse Brecheisen captured third place with 98, and Bret Crigler posted the same score to earn the junior gold prize. Both picked up two other handicap trophies during Prelim Week.

Dusty Cox prevailed in a shootoff of 97s for event fourth place, while Shelton Shively and James S. Jenkins were fifth and sixth. Eli Dunphy headed juniors with 97, and William Wallis and Steven Williamson were senior vet winner and runnerup with the same score. Dunphy was also junior champ in Prelim Friday's handicap.

Tom Grooms and Mike W. Dennis topped sub-vet and veteran ranks with 96, while Kayla Workman and Tyler Honnold were the Lady I and sub-junior winners for 95s. Genevieve Davis topped Lady II standings with 92.

On Prelim Friday Davis earned another Lady II crown, and Honnold was 27-yard champ. Workman was also Lady I champ Thursday.

Little Egypt Golf Cars Doubles

Foster Bartholow topped four others with 100s to claim the doubles crown. His perfect score in Thursday's twins was one of three he had during Prelim Week and gave him the 100 he needed to win the carryover.

Keith Ditto's 99 in carryover earned him the runnerup award, and Chase Horton placed third for the second year in a row, this time with 48 extras. Samantha Foppe and Andrew Bush posted 49s in the carryover and took home the Lady I and junior awards.

Bartholow earned awards in all of Prelim Week's doubles events and topped the Super 500 with 498. Ditto collected a total of five doubles prizes during the Grand, including second place in the Super 500, where Horton was AAA winner. Chase also secured twin-bird trophies on Prelim Friday and Sunday with 100s. Foppe earned seven other Lady I doubles trophies.

with 98, while Tommy Keeshan and Hayden C. Miller were the AA and A victors with the same score. Xavier Bartley's 96 headed B ranks. Kaden Westfall broke 97 for the C crown, and Thomas Fester netted D honors with 92. Stacey's five other doubles trophies from the Grand included AAA in the championship. Westfall topped C standings in the feature twins.

Nicholas Jessie let just one fly unbroken in the program, and he took home the junior

gold trophy. Greg Surber and Dean Neumann were the sub-vet and veteran winners with 98s, while Steven Margherio and Gary Sherrod claimed the sub-junior and senior vet titles with 97s. Neumann placed second in sub-vet ranks last year; he claimed trophies in seven of the Grand's eight doubles events plus the Super 500.

Sandra Jo Jack's 96 earned her the Lady II prize Wednesday, one of five doubles trophies she collected.

Aidan Master



Fifteen-year-old Aidan Master of Manila, AR, crushed 99 plus 25 extras to capture the top trophy during the TRAP & FIELD Handicap.

He gained two yards, putting him at 22.5. "This was my first 99 in handicap; I'm still looking for that 100. It felt good to win," he said. When asked if he was nervous in the shootoff, he replied, "Yes. This was my first big shootoff, and it was lots of fun." In the President's Handicap he won sub-junior runnerup with 95. In the Challenger Handicap he shot 98 plus four extra rounds to lasso the champion prize and picked up another two yards for his 98. He exited the Grand at 24.5.

This was also Aidan's first full year shooting a lot of clay birds. He racked up 12,400 registered targets during 2020's target year. "I had a very good time," he added. At Cardinal Center after the Grand, he earned a half yard for his 96 in the Handicap Championship and won the sub-junior award.

Aidan raked in many trophies at each shoot this year. He claimed several at his state shoot

in Arkansas, including fourth place in the Handicap Championship. He was non-resident sub-junior winner in the feature doubles at Louisiana state. He collected out-state C in the class singles at Kentucky.

He got his start through the Arkansas Youth Shooting Sports Program (AYSSP). In 2018 his friend Coby Hollis helped get him signed up in the ATA. Aidan shot for the first time at the Black River T&S.

He is a sophomore at Manila High School, where his favorite subject is science. He shoots a Kolar and likes to use Winchester and Federal shells. His home clubs are Black River and Harrisburg TC. He likes to practice a couple times a week. His hobbies include duck hunting, fishing and riding 4-wheelers.

This year at the AIM Grand Nationals during the Singles Championship event, his Harrisburg team won sub-junior runnerup honors. Shooting as a team and meeting new friends are the things he likes best about the AIM program.

A dozen shooters headed Grand Week Wednesday's Challenger Ammunition Handicap with 98s, and it took Aidan Master four extra sets to prevail over runnerup Jason Goudreau and become the first to win two yardage events at this Grand. Master earned runnerup prizes in both races Tuesday: sub-junior in the handicap and C in the doubles.

Aidan's dad Aaron explained, "My son was struggling, and they really helped. We have built a lifelong friendship with Jim and Tanner." The best advice Aidan has received was from Jim, who said, "One target at a time."

His favorite ATA tournaments are the Arkansas State Shoot and the Spring Grand. "I get to see people I know. They have good trophies, and I like the weather and background in Tucson." The challenge of shooting and meeting new people are the things he likes best about the sport.

Stacy Rehor broke 100 plus 250 more in carryover to top all competitors in the MEC Outdoors Singles, while Foster Bartholow's 100 plus 50 in carryover in the Precision Fit Stocks by Target Shotguns Doubles earned him his second twin-bird crown of the 2020 Grand American. Dave Dressler posted a 99 from 27 yards to win the Trapshooting USA Handicap outright.

MEC Outdoors Singles

After a loss on her first post Wednesday, Stacy Rehor proceeded to run the rest of Prelim Week's singles targets, winning the Lady I title in the Super 400 with a near-perfect score. She earned her category's crown on Wednesday and Friday and was runnerup Saturday. During Grand Week's Singles Class Championship, she and brother Denis L. Bringelson snared their fifth Sibling championship.

Earlier in the 2020 target year, Rehor captured the Colorado state singles title with 200, and she was non-resident high gun in the Kansas Singles Championship, also with a double-century. At the Nebraska state tournament, she took Lady I in the main 16s after 200 and a 13-round shootoff for out-state first place with Jack Knaus, the only shooter to break all of Prelim Week's singles birds at this year's Grand. Knaus' 249 in the carryover for this event got him the junior title.

Patrick Stacey broke 100 and 248 in carryover, earning runnerup honors. He also

claimed the No. 2 trophy in the Super 400 with 399 and was AAA winner in the Prelim Friday singles and high gun in the Champion of Champions with 100s.

Dagen Voigtman's 224 carryover tally earned him the junior gold crown. He broke 399 of Prelim Week's 16-yard birds, taking the junior gold title in the Super 400.

Caleb D. Fischer was event third place after 100. AAA winners with perfect tallies were Sean Hawley, who took the title, plus Perry Weiner and Chandler Brown, runnerup and third. James S. Jenkins and Maury Goble were AA winner and runnerup after 100s.

Placing one-two-three in Lady I ranks for perfect centuries were Shelby Skaggs, Bridget Bearden and Elizabeth Ternes. Skaggs went on to land the Lady I title in the Clay Target Championship the following week.

Sandra Jo Jack moved up one spot from her second-place finish in Lady II last year, securing the category title with 100. It was one of eight singles trophies she won during the tournament, including the category title in the Clay Target Championship.

Gilbert Palmer topped sub-junior standings with 100, while Dakota Sliger and Cole Henning placed second and third. Sliger's perfect score in this event was his first, while Henning's was his second, having broken his first the day before.

Collecting sub-vet trophies with 100s were Scott Syme, first; David Deitch, second; and Bobby Chambers, third. Syme's two other

Hayden Jacobs and Kaden Westfall landed junior runnerup and third, while Luke Cowart and defending category champ Evan Ingalls placed two-three in junior gold. All posted 100s in the program.

Lawrence Gillum and Chanse Brecheisen were the Class A and B winners with 99s. Glen Beck topped C standings after a 98, and Dylan Hall landed D honors with 97.

Ziggy Tkaczenco's 88 earned him the chair trophy. His other category titles this day included the handicap with 87 and doubles with 86.

This was Workman's second Lady I handicap crown in two days and the second year she has won this award.

Kyle Fifer and Jarrett Carlisle were sub-junior winner and runnerup with 97s, while Dagen Voigtman and Noah Boyer placed one-two in junior gold with the same score. Edward Miller's 97 led senior vets. Two days later Voigtman, who was junior runnerup in this event last year, won top handicap honors with 100, and he entered another perfect score in the Grand American Handicap, becoming the first to enter two 100s in handicap at the same Grand.

The next day, she shot 98 in the Event 5 yardage race to collect the category award. She broke her personal best of 99 in the Precision Fit Stock Doubles to lasso in yet

another Lady I title. On Saturday she entered a 96 to earn the 25-26 runnerup trophy in the Krieghoff 100 Handicap, and she ended on Sunday taking category third place in the Millennium Super 500 Handicap. "It was a pretty good week; the Grand is always a lot of fun," she said.

During the 2020 target year, she claimed Lady I wins in the championship singles, doubles, all-around and high-over-all at Arkansas. "It's a nice range at the shooting sports complex in Jacksonville, and we always have a good time," she said. When Kayla was in seventh grade, she was invited to shoot on the high school trap team. "I shot terrible, but it was a lot of fun," she said. Doyle Gaskins and Steve Mathis taught her everything she knows about this sport.

Kayla joined the ATA in 2017 with help from friend and ATA'er Logan Applegate.

Kayla has been shooting AIM for the past three years. Her Central Arkansas trap team won the sub-junior AA singles award at the 2019 AIM Grand. Kayla also earned the sub-junior ladies' singles trophy with 196 that year. Practicing and shooting as a team are what she likes best about the AIM program.

She likes the challenge in trapshooting—"I can't get enough of it." Her home club is the Jacksonville Shooting Complex, where she practices as often as she can. Kayla likes to squad at random to meet new people and learn from them.

A first-time Lady I All-American on the first team, Kayla told T&F, "My goal is to make the people I know and the people of Arkansas proud." She is working toward breaking 200 in singles and staying on the All-American team.

The best advice she has received came from her dad Rob. When she doesn't shoot well, they talk about it, and he says, "Just shoot better." Kayla noted, "That always helps."

Her favorite ATA tournament is the Grand American because she has a lot of fun making memories with new friends. Kayla's favorite discipline is doubles. "They are fast and fun."

Her advice to new shooters: "Follow the three Ps: practice, patience and persistence."

Posting 99 each, Dakota Sliger was first among B shooters, and Glen Jorgensen was high in C class. Scott Cokenour was D winner with 97 and 50 in carryover.

All the top category champions entered 100s, and some had all three places with

centuries and carryovers. In Lady I Stacy Rehor, Shelby Skaggs and Emma Grace Mathews were first through third. All three sub-juniors were perfect: Landon Sievers, first; Jordan Ziercher, second; and Jayden Dalton, third. Junior first through third were Breydon Paxson, Jack Knaus and Caleb Clayton. In junior gold ranks, Riley Ross, Noah Gouge and Dagen Voigtman were one-two-three. Winning sub-vets were James K. Frost, Scott Syme and David Deitch.

Shelly Heitner was top Lady II with the lone 100. Among vets, Mel Hensley and Mike W. Dennis were winner and runnerup. Ray Stafford and Chris Erickson were one-two among senior vets.

Ziggy Tkaczenko carded a 95 to win the chair award for the third consecutive year.

Gipson-Ricketts Handicap

Jayden Dalton blasted his second century of the day, this time in the handicap race to earn champion honors outright. James G. Boswell posted a 99 for the runnerup trophy. A scramble of 98s vied for place awards. Chase Horton landed third with his perfect round of OT. Landon Sievers and Cody A. Davis were fourth and fifth. Tim Reed and Rick W. 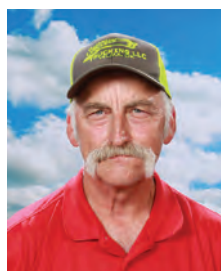

Fourteen-year-old Jayden Dalton of Pochontas, AR, broke the lone 100 in Friday's Gipson-Ricketts Handicap on Prelim Friday. This was his first 100 in handicap. "It felt good to win. My adrenaline was pumping on the last target," he said. This 100 in handicap came just hours after smashing his career-first 100 in the morning's singles event, good for sub-junior third in the Sterling Cut Glass Singles. "My dad was very happy and excited for me," he told TRAP & FIELD.

Jayden started his Grand earning the top sub-junior trophy outright with 99 in Event 6

doubles the day before. By the end of Prelim Week, he'd picked up the 23-24 runnerup trophy in the Millennium Luxury Coaches Super 500 Handicap. He also claimed category third in the QMaxx Super 500 Doubles.

During Grand Week he broke 199 in the Winchester AA Class Singles to earn the sub-junior title. He carded a 95 in the Caesar Guerini Handicap to pick up the sub-junior third award. "It was a good time," Jayden said.

At this year's Kansas State Shoot, Jayden took home his first Shamrock Leathers bag when he placed third in the non-resident Handicap Championship field with a 97. "I worked hard to win. It meant so much to me."

Jayden is a freshman at Pochontas Public Schools, and his favorite subject is history. He shoots a Browning Citori Plus and likes to use Remington shells. In his spare time he hunts, fishes, plays football, and spends time with family.

The first-time sub-junior All-American got his start with help from his older brother Austin, who has been an ATA member since 2012. Austin would take him to shoots, where Jayden would sit and watch. "It looked like fun, so I started shooting. My brother showed me a lot, and I learned so much from him." Jayden joined the ATA in 2015 at nine years old.

He enjoys meeting new people and traveling to different places to compete. "I like to learn from people," he said. Jayden is an AIM member and shoots with the Redskin

Dusters team. When asked what he liked best about AIM, he replied, "I just like to shoot." At the AIM Grand Nationals this year, Jayden won sub-junior runnerup in the doubles and all-around.

His home club is Black River T&SC, and he likes to practice as much as he can. He usually squads at random when he is not shooting with his teammates. In 2017 he attended a Nora Ross clinic. "I learned a lot about the fundamentals of the sport in that class," he said.

His favorite ATA tournament is the Louisiana State Shoot. "They have a nice background," Jayden said. The best advice he has received came from his brother: "Keep on breathing and don't think about it. Go out and do the best you can do."

Jayden had three punches during 2020, then received the two-yard punch at the Grand, leaving there on 25.5 yards. He picked up another three feet at the North Carolina State Shoot in late August.

The main goals he is working hard to achieve are to stay on the All-American team and complete his ATA Grand Slam. His favorite discipline is doubles. "It's more of a challenge," he said.

Jayden travels with dad Jeff a lot and mom Christy when she is able to get away. His advice to others: "Take your time and focus. Don't be in a rush, and only do what you can do."

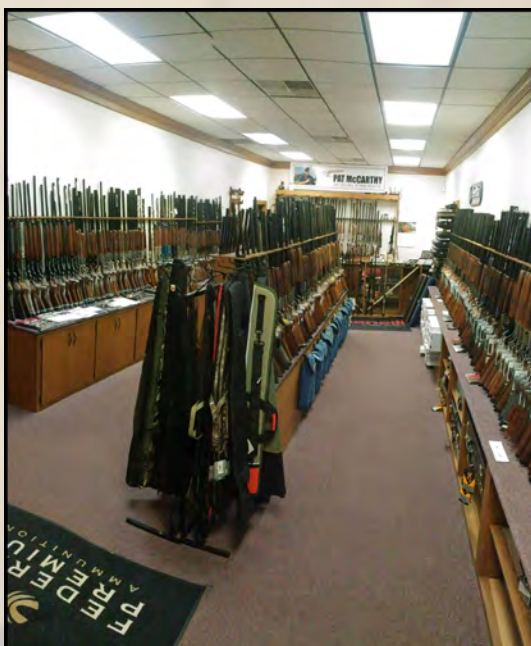

All three events on Saturday, Aug. 8 were won with perfect scores. Chris Vendel captured the singles after carryover. Dagen Voigtman blasted 100 in handicap plus extras. Sean Hawley added another 100 to his doubles roster and continued with carryover. Shooters were called to their benches at 9:15 a.m. due to a rain delay.

NRA Singles

Chris Vendel ran the Singles Class and the first 100 of the Clay Target Championship to tally the 250 in carryover he needed to claim the NRA title. Justin DeWitt ran the next 200 but left Grand competition after Monday's event, ending with the runnerup trophy on the forfeit. Darrell Farr was third after posting 199 in carryover, then another 250 to best Bruce D. Davis' 199-249 for top AAA honors. In AA Troy Balk, Kenneth Mitchell and Adam Stefkovich were first through third with 100 each and carryovers. Donald Wagner and Jesse Secrest were first and second in A standings.

Krieghoff 100 Handicap

Dagen Voigtman blasted the first of his two 100s in handicap during the tournament. According to TRAP & FIELD records, he is the first to enter two centuries in handicap at the same Grand. He claimed the champion trophy after one round over Kody Rogers, who ended with junior honors.

Five ATA'ers entered 99 each. Tangling for place trophies, Steven Byrd grabbed the runnerup spot after one extra round. Joseph Charnigo and Foster Bartholow went out for a second bout and ended third and fourth, respectively. Brayden Tarantino went straight to his category to pick up the No. 1 trophy for

sub-junior, and Chris Vendel did the same in sub-vet.

Jarrod Everly prevailed in a shootoff of 98s for fifth place. Taking sixth, seventh and eighth were Zachari Nannini, Randy G. Miller and Donald Schaffer Jr. Category winners with 98 included Isaac Sharp for junior gold first and Payton Gentry for second. Jack Knaus was junior runnerup. Steve Noland and Tom Grooms were second and third in the sub-vet arena.

Megan Bierman, Emma Williams and Shelby Skaggs claimed first through third in the Lady I division. Criona Doorly was Lady II winner, and Martha Humphrey was next, both with 94 each.

William Van Nieuwenhuyzen and James Rowe shot 96 apiece for vet and senior vet awards.

This was Sean Hawley's second of three top doubles trophies during the Grand's Preliminary Week. He entered another 100 in the Event 14 twins, and followed through with 50 more in carryover to secure the No. 1 slot Saturday.

Sean Hawley secured his third consecutive No. 1 doubles trophy for 100 straight. The first 50 of his century in Grand Week Tuesday's class race gave him Sunday's top spot over seven others who were perfect in that program.

Foster Bartholow led Prelim Week's All-Around scoring with 299x300. He also paced the Super 500 Doubles with 498.

Seventeen-year-old Jack Knaus was perfect on the prelim singles' 400 total.

Nineteen-year-old Dagen Voigtman led the 900-target HOA with 882, the 1,400-bird HOA with 1,372, and the Super 500 Handicap with 484.

Blaser Handicap, Dawson Enterprises Doubles

Three were near-perfect in the day's handicap: DiGesualdo, Anthony Fortino and Rick W. Fuller. Nick and Tony continued to a second extra inning after 24 apiece, leaving Rick behind in third place after two misses. DiGesualdo broke 24 again to edge runnerup Fortino by one.

Dillon Stum entered the lone non-category 98 and won the overall fourth-place award. The same score won top trophies for Julie Newsom, Lady I leader by two; Jack Holland, sub-junior; Riley Ross, junior gold; and Gary R. Nichols, senior vet.

Foster Bartholow, champion in Wednesday's and Thursday's doubles, finished second in Sunday's contest with 49 in carryover to Sean Hawley's 50. Richard Marshall Jr. claimed third place with 48, while Chase Horton and Patrick Stacey netted first- and second-place trophies in AAA.

Matching their 100s in regulation were junior gold victor Patrick Hopson plus Christina Byrd and Shelby Skaggs, one-two in the Lady I division. Dave Bicknell was AAA third following a 99, while Jeff Nostrom's 99 headed AA ranks.

Earning category honors with near-perfect scores were Samantha Foppe, Lady I third; sub-juniors Tuff Hutchins and Drake

All-Around, HOAs, Super 500 events

Foster Bartholow's 299 led the All-Around by one over junior gold leader Dagen Voigtman. Tim Reed headed the shooters with 296 for overall second place, needing a couple rounds of carryover to relegate Zachari Nannini to third spot. Chase Horton was AAA victor after the tie-breaker, and Ian Lawrence took junior outright for his 296.

Reed landed second in the 900-target HOA as well, totaling 879 and besting third-place Horton in carryover. Patrick Hopson headed the category winners with 877, good for the junior gold No. 1 trophy when Voigtman took overall champion.

Horton and Reed swapped places in the 1,400-bird HOA, Chase taking runnerup with 1,370 and Reed third with five less. Hopson was again leader of the category contingent, securing junior gold recognition with 1,366, six under event winner Voigtman.

Jack Knaus was the lone shooter to run Prelim Week's 400 singles, and he landed the top 16-yard trophy on opening day. Thursday's event winner, Stacy Rehor, totaled 399 for the week and pocketed the Lady I award. Others

picking up honors for near-perfect totals were Pat Stacey, runnerup after a reverse-score tie-breaker with third place Nannini; and Voigtman, junior gold.

Dagen headed the Super 500 Handicap with 484, Reed was second with 481, and Horton ended third for 479. Donald Schaffer Jr. and Keith Ditto landed in that order among 27-yarders after 477 apiece.

Bartholow's 498 on the week's twins put him in the Super 500 Doubles top slot by two over runnerup Ditto. Stacey was third after a 494 deadlock with Horton, who collected the top AAA award. Matching their totals were junior champ Lawrence and junior gold winner Hopson.

Bridget Bearden's 96 earned her Lady I runnerup honors as well as a first-time punch to the 27.

Shelby Skaggs collected Lady I third after a four-way knot at 95. This day she broke 100 in doubles for the first time and collected category runnerup recognition after carryover. She was Lady I victor in the Prelim Week All-Around and both HOAs, and she took home prizes on the 400 singles and 500 doubles as well.

This was the fourth straight year that Deborah Ohye-Neilson has topped Lady II standings

in the All-Around and both HOAs. Ian Lawrence took junior awards in those three events. Winning both HOAs were Steven Margherio,

sub-junior; Patrick Hopson, junior gold (after Voigtman earned the overall top positions in both); Ray Stafford, senior vet; and Ziggy

Tkaczenco, chair. Mel Hensley was veteran champ in the All-Around and 1,400-target HOA.

Nick DiGesualdo

Nick DiGesualdo of Castle Rock, CO, broke 99 from the back fence then 24-24 in shootoff to claim the champion spot in the final Grand Prelim Week yardage contest, the Blaser Handicap, on Aug. 9. He was shooting a Kolar low-profile fixed rib and Federal 3-dram plastic Gold Medals.

Nick was the last one on the board with 99 that day, having missed No. 71, his "nemesis target": a quarter left from Post 3. He's had around 15 near-perfect handicap scores, and one of those was for the very same type of target. He still sees it in his memory, and this one immediately reminded him of that other one.

He broke 100 from the 27 on July 4 four years ago at Golden GC in Aurora.

The Grand win was especially sweet because he's battled eye problems since around 2008. "My eyes went so bad so quick," he recounted. After three surgeries on his left eye and one on his right, shooting had still been hit and miss (literally) until about a year ago, when he began to find ways to manage his vision better. He now wears a special contact in the left eye and has a custom lens for the right.

Nick's family being immersed in trapshooting inspired him to start when he was in a position to be able to do so. He began shooting in his late 40s, first registering targets in 1997. He's been traveling extensively for about 10 years and is now retired from his commercial tiling business. Wife Sandy, who was shooting next to him on Post 5 on Prelim Sunday, has been shooting since 2014 after they married. They divide their time between homes in the Denver area and Phoenix.

His uncles Nick, Robert and Tom plus his brother Russell, who has made custom stocks for many shooters, have helped him in various ways. He especially thanked another Colorado shooter, 16-time All-American Denis Bringelson, both for his inspiring ability and accomplishments and for his assistance with his vision issues, talking through what was going on with him and suggesting possible solutions. Phil Kiner was also a help on this front.

Nick and cousin Steven DiGesualdo are first-time All-Americans this year, both earning berths on the 2021 sub-vet team. Nick garnered points from the Blaser event plus the Autumn and Spring Grands; ATA Southwestern Zone; Colorado, Kansas, New Mexico, South Dakota and Wyoming state shoots; and the preliminary Autumn and Spring Grand tournaments. His points this target year include ones at Autumn, preliminary Autumn,



Smashing 99 to tie for top handicap honors Sunday were Anthony Fortino, Nick DiGesualdo and Rick W. Fuller. The year 2020 has been challenging, but for Zach Nannini it was also a year of firsts. The 29-year-old racked up trophies and points to make his debut on the ATA All-American open first team for 2021. Zach has an impressive record of making the sub-junior, junior and junior gold All-American teams, captaining the junior team for 2009. He was especially honored to be named to the open team this year. Zach also had an impressive showing at the Grand American, where he won seven trophies during Prelim Week and six during Grand Week.

His favorite memory from the Grand was his shootoff with Keith Ditto and Derrick Mein for event runnerup in the championship All-Around. Each contender broke 394, and after the two-round tie-breaker, Zach secured the trophy. Keith was third and Derrick AAA champ.

Zach told TRAP & FIELD, "I was really, really proud of my 2020 Grand. I take my hat off to Dagen Voigtman for breaking the 400—that was incredible, and there were so many other great shooters there. Just the nostalgia of the shoot . . . it felt like Vandalia and the old times of the Grand American, in my opinion."

Zach joined the ATA in 2004 after a friend of his father's, Tim Silvera, introduced him to the sport. His parents were adamant about Zach learning gun safety from a young age, and he quickly developed a love for shooting. A trip with Tim to try out trapshooting was all it took to get Zach hooked on the sport.

Zach grew up in San Jose and has many California state titles. He won the doubles crown in 2009 with 100, three consecutive junior gold singles titles from 2012 to 2014, and the all-around title in 2014.

In 2010 Zach went to Lindenwood University in St. Charles, MO, on a trapshooting scholarship. He earned an MBA and was trap captain of their shotgun sports team. Zach has relocated to the St. Louis area and is a successful financial planner with Northwestern Mutual. Many of Zach's clients are people he has met through the ATA.

He uses a Krieghoff K-80 ACS with a Wenig custom stock and BRAIN Choke tubes. He also likes to shoot Remington STS and Nitro 27 shells. Zach's home clubs are Gateway GC and Daniel Boone GC. His favorite place to shoot is the MTA homegrounds in Linn Creek. He has great memories of competing there and has grown very comfortable breaking targets there.

Zach has a long list of accomplishments, including completing his Grand Slam in 2009, an accolade he is very proud of. His favorite

part of being a trapshooter is the relationships he has developed; some of his best friends have come into his life through shooting. Zach's advice to new shooters is to have fun with the sport. He suggests finding some accomplished shooters to learn from and to just work on getting consistent.

Zach's goals are to be on the Missouri state team and to continue his run on the All-American team. Long term, he would like to win each of the five rings at the Grand American, captain the All-American team, and eventually try for the Trapshooting Hall of Fame. He has also just recently gotten married to wife Elizabeth. Many may remember Zach's romantic proposal in front of the grandstands at the 2018 Grand American.

When he is not shooting, Zach likes hunting with his wife, traveling, cooking, and being around friends. He also enjoys a good cigar and a nice glass of Kentucky bourbon from time to time.

Zach would like to thank his mother and father Susan and David for sacrificing and giving him the support he needed to get where he is today. His trapshooting heroes and mentors such as Leo Harrison III, Rick Marshall Jr. and Dave Kelly inspired him to achieve the level of success that he has. Zach also expressed his gratitude to Tim Silvera for introducing him to trapshooting and his good friend Bob Graves. Zach regards Bob as being one of the most influential people in his shooting career and is thankful for their time together, working on improving their shooting games. He also expressed a big thank you to Krieghoff, Bobby Chambers at Wenig Custom Gunstocks, and BRAIN Chokes for their support.

Jack Knaus of Kimball, MN, carded a perfect 400x400 during Grand Preliminary Week to win the top trophy in the Winchester Super 400 Singles. "This is one of my best accomplishments, and it meant a lot to me," he said. His streak started with Event 1, which he won with 175 in carryover. He earned the junior award in Event 4 and landed category runnerup in Friday's 16s. In all, he took home six prelim trophies.

At this year's Central Zone, Jack won top junior prizes in the class doubles and Doubles Championship, posting 98 in each. During the Nebraska State Shoot, he was non-resident winner over the Singles Championship field with a 200 and 324 in the shootoff. He went on to earn the non-resident high-over-all and junior all-around.

This year the Minnesota state tournament was canceled due to COVID-19 restrictions, but last year he won the doubles title over the field with 98. "It was my first in-state championship. I felt like it was a great win," he said. During the class twins he broke his first 100 in doubles and took home the junior trophy.

During the 2020 Heartland Grand, he

earned junior titles in the Doubles Championship with a 98 and the feature handicap with a 97. "It was a good shoot to cap off the year," Jack said.

The 18-year-old is a senior at Kimball Area High School, where his favorite subject is English. In his spare time he enjoys waterfowl hunting. He shoots a Kolar Max Trap Unsingle Combo and uses Winchester shells on handicap and Fiocchi on singles and doubles. He made the 2021 All-American junior first team. He had previously been on the 2018 sub-junior team.

Jack got his start in this sport when he was six years old. His dad Tom took him to their local Kimball R&GC, where he shot trap for the first time using a 20-gauge pump and broke two out of 25. Jack joined the ATA when he was 10 years old and competed in the Minnesota Singles Championship, where he carded a 192 and earned the novice award. Jack also shoots with his high school team, where his dad is the coach. "My dad is a good coach, and he enjoys it," he told TRAP & FIELD.

Jack likes hanging out and shooting with friends. He likes to squad with pals Layne Zabokrtsky, Max Christiansen, Chris Gardner, Mitchell Germany, Wyatt Kile and Dylan Hafer when he can.

Jack made his way to the back fence at the 2017 Minnesota State Shoot with a 96 in the Handicap Championship, and he won the sub-junior runnerup trophy. "That was a big goal, to make the 27 marker," he said.

Jack noted that Pat Lamont has been a big idol of his. "We have shot together at Minnesota for five years. He has offered me mental advice on how to stay focused, and he is my biggest influence and a good friend."

His favorite ATA tournament is the Great Lakes Grand. "My dad and I usually go together, and it's always a good time," he smiled. Shooting goals he is working on are to stay on the All-American team and to have a good year. The best advice he has received came from his dad: "Stay positive, whether you shoot good or not."

Jack's favorite discipline is doubles. "They are the least stressful and most fun to shoot," he said. He usually travels to tournaments with friends. Mom Donita is a professional bodybuilder. "She just won her first women's world championship," he noted. His advice to new shooters: "Don't overthink it. Always have fun and enjoy yourself."

Before retirement Larry shot skeet with friends, the late Roy Howerton and the late Tom Schrode. "I liked to beat them," he

laughed. Larry decided to buy a trap barrel and shoot trap for fun. In 1996 he and Tom attended their first Grand American in Vandalia, OH. "The shopping was great, and I haven't missed a Grand since. I've met a lot of excellent friends through trap."

When asked what he liked best about the sport, he replied, "I like to shoot and load shells." His goal is to break 200 singles and to stay consistent. The best advice he has received came from a lot of different people. "Don't over-think a shot; call for the bird, you see it, you shoot it."

His favorite ATA tournament is the Grand American. "You get to compete against the best in the world!" His favorite discipline is doubles. "I love doubles—there's not enough time to think," he chuckled.

His advice to new shooters: "Don't give up. You have to miss birds to learn how to hit them."

Robert E. Dyer shot a 199 plus one round of OT to capture the singles title at the 22nd Dixie Grand American held Sept. 29-Oct. 4 at the North Carolina Homegrounds in Bostic. He tied fellow senior vet shooter Sheldon Hostetter, who landed category honors.

Sub-junior Tyler Honnold blasted the only 98 in the Doubles Championship for the title. Junior golfer Luke Cowart carded a 97 from the back fence for handicap laurels, and he claimed the all-around with 391x400, leading the field by seven targets. Bruce D. Davis led high-over-all standings by five birds, totaling 957x1,000.

This was the homeground's fourth year of hosting the Dixie Grand, and the club extended a gracious welcome to 411 shooters and their families from 26 states.

Championship events

Following the 199s in the main singles, there was a tangle of 198s. After the shootoff dust settled, Tim Fields earned event runnerup with 25 straight extras. Michael Gooch landed the AAA prize, and Kevin Stephens was AA winner. Posting 198s and collecting category awards were Landon Meadows, junior; Heidi Womer, Lady I; Carl Chadwell and Urban

Womer, sub-vets; David Bessine, vet; and Curtis Paul, senior vet runnerup.

In the doubles, trailing Honnold's 98, Caleb Dancy and Cowart carded 97 apiece for junior and junior gold awards. Shooting 96 each, Bruce Davis collected runnerup, Steve Huber was vet winner, and Emma Grace Mathews was Lady I victor. She also excelled in her category for the all-around and HOA.

In the handicap, just one bird behind champion Cowart, Cassie Hammond and Randy Krick turned in 96 each for Lady II and vet trophies. Hammond was overall champion in this race last year. She matched her category record high this year. Ashlyn Forester and Gary Ferguson Jr. broke 95 each, good for Lady I and sub-vet, while David Shuster was veteran runnerup with the same score. Overall second and third after 94s were Aaron Willoughby and Tyler Waits, respectively.

Bobby Bilbrey swept the chair awards in the championship events.

Prelim-event highlights

On opening day William Sharp Jr. snared the handicap top award with 96, and Caleb Dancy shot 95 for junior honors. Pacing the doubles with 96 were Ryan Denes, AA. Jerry

Osborne III and Luke Cowart, junior gold, one-two; and Urban Womer, sub-vet.

In Wednesday's doubles opener, Bruce Davis walloped 99 for AAA winner, and Jacob Duren posted a 98 for junior accolades. In the day's second twins event, two led with 98: Denes collected AA, and Neil Alexander won senior vet.

On Thursday's handicap, Robert Dyer and Davis matched 97s and ended winner and runnerup after one extra set. In the class doubles, Osborn was high with 99, good for junior gold honors, with Noah Gouge taking second for one less.

Like last year, Aaron Willoughby won the Caesar Guerini Handicap on Friday, this time with 96 from the back marker. James T. Allnutt was second with 95, and Logan Meadows was junior winner, also with 95.

At the 35th Northeastern Grand American, Chris Vendel made a near sweep of the championship events. He won the singles, doubles, all-around and high-over-all during the Sept. 15-20 tournament at the NYSATA Homegrounds in Cicero, NY.

Thomas Lamonica captured the handicap crown after 92 and two extra rounds over Charles Sample, who took sub-vet honors.

Championship events

Vendel shot a 198 in the feature singles and tied with Jeff Ravella. The two went six rounds until Ravella let one slip, then another. Vendel netted the title with 150 in OT. Ravella ended with the sub-vet award.

Joseph Kopacz and Casey Luttrell knotted at 197 for second. It took one set for Kopacz to cinch the runnerup spot, and Luttrell ended tops in AAA. Shooting 196 apiece, Bob Malmstedt was second in AAA, and Daniel Schaffer led Class B. Heidi Womer also turned in a 196 for Lady I laurels. She claimed the category doubles plus defended her all-around and HOA titles from last year.

Carding 195, Daniel Tartick bested Doug Divello for sub-vet runnerup after one extra round. With the same score, Robert Edwards and Michael Jubin ended first and second among vets.

Deborah Ohye-Neilson and Joseph Wheeler entered 194 each for Lady II and senior vet awards. Debbie won her category title again this year in singles and handicap, and it was the fourth consecutive time she has won the all-around and HOA.

Salvatore Dellaneve shot his career-first

100 during the 16s championship, and he won the junior trophy with a 193 total.

Vendel downed the lone 99 in the feature twins for No. 1 in the event with a three-target lead. Leonardo Henriquez was runnerup and John Federici senior vet champ for their 96s. Greg Tartick won AA for 95. Donald Schaffer Jr. was AAA winner with 94; Brian Luther and Chris Landon were A first and second, posting 94 each. Ron Ostrowski Jr. earned junior gold with 93, and Sheldon Hostetter was senior vet runnerup with 92. Genevieve Davis took Lady II laurels after 91.

In the main handicap, trailing Lamonica and Sample were Darrin Cooke, Ronald Sank II and Mark Fritz., who placed second through third with 91s and shootoff. Five entered 90 each in categories. Aaron Leone and Paul Rapoli won junior and vet accolades. John Valenti and Leroy Cook were senior vet winner and runnerup. Earl Raub Jr. collected the sub-vet second trophy.

As he did last year, William Ross won the chair award in the 16s, doubles and handicap.

Vendel's 387x400 led the all-around field by 11 birds, with Donald Schaffer Jr. landing AAA after 376. Vendel led HOA standings with 945x1,000. Michael Fox Jr. took AAA honors with 937.

Prelim-event highlights

On opening day, Douglas Carroll topped the handicap with 92 for the winner's trophy. Entering 97 each in the twins event, Donald Neilson Jr. was winner after carryover, and Joshua Buchiere took Class AA.

On Wednesday two carded 95 in the

handicap. David Laliberte collected the winner's prize, and Donald Neilson Jr. took sub-vet. In the doubles, Michael Fox Jr. was top gun with 96, and Neilson won sub-vet with 95.

In Thursday's yardage race, Randolph Thurlow and Fox were first and second with 95 each and two sets of OT. In the twins, three knotted at 96. After carryovers, Curtis Robbins was winner, and James Flint bested Steven Manos for sub-vet.

Bonnie Cobado was Lady I winner in handicap events on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday plus in the championship on Sunday. Criona Doorly earned Lady II trophies in Thursday's and Friday's yardage races.

On Friday Thomas Murphy III was high gun with 92 in the Caesar Guerini Handicap. Simon Grech was runnerup, and Frank Benvenuto took senior vet honors, both with 91. In the class doubles, entering 94 each, Vendel was sub-vet and Michael Waschitz senior vet. Ron Ostrowski Jr. collected junior gold after 93.

Kolar presented the all-around trophies and again plans to sponsor a special shootoff at the Grand American. All-around champions from the Satellite Grand tournaments of the 2021 target year will be eligible to shoot off for the 2021 Kolar National Satellite Grand Championship during the Grand.

White Flyer presented the high-over-all awards.

A total of 420 shooters from 13 states attended the tournament.

Unfortunately, as Jeff tells it, they just happened to park in a reserved spot unintentionally, received a bit of a reprimand, and since then decided to rent their own spot where they can set up a tent and relax between rounds. Jeff's wife Dianne, a former sergeant in the military, does not attend shoots with her husband but is encouraging of his passion.

Jeff, who played semi-pro baseball and had a tryout for the Cincinnati Reds, feels that pressure of sorts is good for an athlete. Although some think of baseball as a team sport, he considers it an individual sport as well.

That philosophy carries over into trap-shooting. He shoots on a regular squad with Sean McCumber, Mark McCumber, Hunter McCumber and Brian Luther. He practices at his Iroquois home club three times a week, pounding at least 100 targets per session. His goal is to reach the 27-yard line (he now stands at 24). Never having taken a formal class, he feels the best advice he has ever received is

from Randy Schrom, who taught him how to set up his gun correctly and is his "go-to" guy whenever he has an issue.

Jeff's advice to new shooters is to "keep your head down and enjoy yourself." He enjoys being as helpful as he can to people, giving back to the sport as much as he can. He is extremely friendly, loves to say hello to everyone, and feels that everyone should "take something positive out of everything they do!" His favorite tournaments are the Pennsylvania State Shoot, Empire Grand and Northeastern Grand. He plans to attend the Southern Grand this year with his daughter Geena Ravella, also a shooter.

When asked about his favorite trophy, he had no hesitation in naming a third-place win in the 2014 New York Handicap Championship. He tied for runnerup with a 96 and shot off against Chris Vendel and four others for two rounds. Jeff ended with third, the other four dropping out in the first set. He said that during the singles shootoff this year he was completely at ease, comfortable and just "zoned in." When it was over, people kept coming up to shake his hand and compliment him on the fact that "there was nothing left of those targets." That made him immeasurably happy.

Jeff shoots a Browning Grade VII Citori. For singles he prefers Remington STS Light 8s; doubles are RIO 1 oz. 8s for the first shot and RIO Elite Light 8s for the second; and for handicap he likes Elite 3-dram loads.

Mike Lefevre paces handicap championship with 98; Scott Obenchain leads 16s, twins, all-around

Scott Obenchain carded perfect scores to claim the singles and doubles titles outright during the 41st Southwestern Grand American. Mike Lefevre broke 98 to head the Handicap Championship.

Obenchain totaled 396x400, three off the tournament record, to claim the all-around crown by four birds. Breaking 392 for AAA laurels was Dalton W. Jennings, who led the HOA field by seven with 1,272x1,300. Jennings collected eight other prizes along the way, all but two with top or second-high scores.

Traditionally held in the spring, the shoot was rescheduled for Sept. 29-Oct. 4 at the NRA Whittington Center in Raton, NM, when the early-April tournament at the National SC venue in San Antonio, TX, was canceled due to COVID-19 pandemic control measures adopted in much of the U.S.

A total of 190 shooters from 18 states shot all or part of the program, and the Doubles Championship entry of 142 surpassed last year's.

Championship events

Scott Obenchain's 200 straight gave him the singles title by one over runnerup Dalton Jennings and junior champ Breydon Paxson. Picking up trophies for 198s were Gregory Ferguson, No. 1 in AAA; Kevin Davis and Steven D. Miller, one-two in sub-vet ranks; and Mel Hensley, senior vet winner.

Stacy Rehor broke 196 and reclaimed the Lady I tiara she earned three years earlier. She went on to secure the other four category titles, with her 1,255 HOA tally a new tournament record, both for the Lady I (previously 1,249) and all-women's (1,243) categories. She also won Wednesday's and Thursday's singles over the field after perfect centuries.

Also accomplishing a category title sweep was Paxson. His 1,265 in the HOA was the high mark entered since Bret Hamilton established the record of 1,270 in 2004.

Trailing Obenchain by one with 99s to vie for doubles runnerup were Sean Hawley and Richard Marshall Jr. Hawley took the place award via a coin toss, and Marshall pocketed the top AAA trophy. After 98s, Jennings

bested Ferguson 20 to 19 in overtime for the AAA runnerup prize. Wyatt DeBrie, in his second ATA season, posted a 97 for the sub-junior title, two down from the tournament record set back in 1999 by Kevin Parrott.

Wyatt Kile and Hawley tangled at 97 for the handicap runnerup trophy. A coin flip put Kile in second place and Sean in third. Senior vet leader, 80-year-old Claude Hensli, tied this event's senior vet record of 97 set by James Grunewald six years ago.

As high male and female in the Handicap Championship, Lefevre and Rehor took home checks of \$10,000 and \$5,000, respectively, courtesy of Bill Martin.

Others racking up more than one category championship included Mary Alby and Dakota Sliger, Lady II and sub-junior victors in the singles, all-around and HOA. Hensley annexed four of the five titles in his new senior vet category, and he was age-group runnerup in the handicap.

Peter Strouse and Dylan Hafer divided the junior gold championships. Strouse secured the singles, handicap and all-around, while Hafer won the doubles and HOA. David Osborn was veteran singles, doubles and all-around champ, while Kevin Davis earned the sub-vet singles and all-around crowns.

Prelim-event highlights

Dalton (Wayne) Jennings was high gun in two prelim handicaps: Wednesday with 97,

and Friday with the week's handicap high of 99. Rick Marshall defeated him and Wyatt Kile after they led Thursday's event with 97s. Justin Cavett was the handicap opener victor, also with 97.

Randy Foster paced Tuesday's doubles with a perfect century. Marshall entered top scores Wednesday and Thursday, landing the top spot the first day with 99 and carryover with Gregory Kayl and taking AAA recognition the second day following 98 and carryover with winner Breydon Paxson.

Sean Hawley and Paxson led the class twins with 100 straights, and Hawley won first place 49 to 46 in carryover with junior victor Breydon.

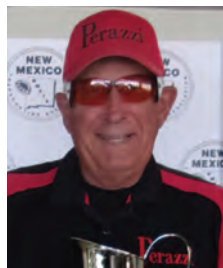
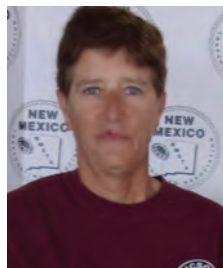

When speaking with Jaylee Bradley, who shoots out of the 4P Gun Club in Melrose, NM, you may forget she is only 17 years old. Now in her senior year at Ft. Sumner High School, Jaylee began her shooting career as a freshman under the guidance of her present

coach, Shawn Perkins, and Joe Whitehouse. Although she will admit to some difficulty juggling school and shooting practice as well as competitions, online classes have given her the opportunity to enhance her shooting skills, allowing her to travel to places such as her first Southwestern Grand held this year at the NRA Whittington Center Sept. 29-Oct. 4.

She travels with her mom Michelle, a lab technician specializing in infection control. Michelle, who is in Jaylee's own words "her whole world," scores at the NRA Center at all their shoots. A hunter, Michelle doesn't shoot trap but loves to watch her daughter shoot, and she says of Jaylee that "she lives life everyday!" Jaylee believes in giving back to the sport she loves, and helping kids starting off in the game is one of her favorite things to do. What she loves most about ATA shooting is the range of different people she meets, learning how they got into the sport and hearing their outlook on shooting.

Michelle, Jaylee and family live in a secluded area of Ft. Sumner and drive an hour and a half to shoot practice every Sunday at 4-P (the name refers to the Perkins family:

Shawn, Lori, Zack and Mackenzie). Jaylee worked all summer to buy a car.

A basketball player before she began shooting, Jaylee says the best advice she ever received regarding her shooting was from Charlie Harris, whose words actually inspired a paper she wrote for school. He told her to have a routine to prepare to shoot: "See the bird, shoot it, and follow through. Don't be lazy!" He would stand behind her and after she would call for the bird, tell her to "shoot now." To Jaylee, those two powerful words took on a special meaning to her. She is currently looking at colleges with shooting teams, and her plans are to concentrate on conservation and ecology.

During the Southwestern Grand she earned 11 trophies, including top junior in the Remington Doubles and six category runnerup awards.

Jaylee shoots a Browning Citori XT Silver. For singles she uses Federal 1 oz. 8s, Federal 1 1/8 oz. 8s for both shots in doubles, and Remington Nitro 7 1/2s for handicap.



Over the years the area surrounding the firing pin hole becomes concave or peened back, causing the primer to back into the concave area. This makes it very hard to open the gun and can break your firing pin. **Barrels Are Required For This Repair.**

Laib's Gunsmithing developed a method to install a firing pin bushing which allows you to use the original firing pin and spring. It makes a nice, neat conversion. The cost is \$325, which includes disassembly, bushing repair, and test firing of the gun. Shipping and other parts are extra. *Note: If the receiver has been previously welded, the cost is \$385.

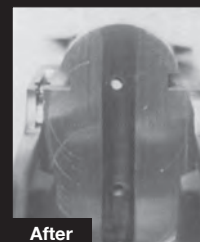

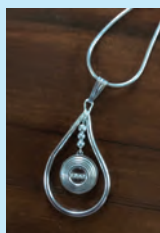

Dave Bicknell broke 95 to collect his third doubles title before leading the high-over-all with 661x700 during the Connecticut State Shoot held Sept. 11-13 at Hartford GC, East Granby. He also won Friday's twins with 96.

Thomas Imperati and two-time handicap winner Antonio Lobo carded 91s in the main yardage contest, and they ended with the first-place and sub-vet awards, respectively. Lobo's 378 tally on the 400 championship targets earned him his ninth all-around crown, and he was high gun in the opening 16s with a perfect score.

After a tie of 90s, David Trykowski was handicap runnerup, and Jeff Swiderski placed third. Swiderski won Friday's handicap with 97. John Joseph took home the veteran trophy for his 90 Sunday. John Kulas and Matthew Wahl claimed the fourth- and fifth-place awards with 89s.

Three posted 197s in the feature 16s, and Hani Hafez, who won the title in 1990 and 1992, did it again. Bicknell, a six-time champ, was runnerup, and Joseph Wheeler was senior

vet winner. He claimed the veteran awards the last two years.

Noelle Feucht's 190 earned her the Lady I title for the sixth straight and seventh total time. Alexander Stuchell landed junior gold honors with 186, and Cheryl Pittera, 2009 women's victor, secured the Lady II tiara with 185. Michael C. Wahl topped sub-junior standings with 173.

Breaking the second-high score among

residents in the main doubles was five-time champ Antonio Lobo, and he ended with the sub-vet prize. Wheeler's 92 got him the senior vet trophy. Defending champ Mike Hamlin landed the No. 2 spot with 91. Hafez, who has won the title seven times, took veteran with the same score.

Michael Waschitz was non-resident victor in the twins with 95, while Christopher Monterotti's 92 was high among all competitors in Sunday's yardage contest and earned him top visitor honors.

He is currently tournament chairman and a member of the Atlantic Indians Trapshooting Association plus past president and a member of Pahquioque R&GC, past chairman of the board and life member of Willow Wood GC, past trap chairman and member of Fairfield Co. F&GPA, and member of Bristol F&GC. He introduced trapshooting software to run local ATA shoots and is still involved in that endeavor today.

Tony says some of the best things about

trapshooting, besides the competition, are the wonderful women and men he has met and the lifelong friendships he has made. "Such friends are remembered long after the scores are forgotten," he said.

Tony was born in New York City. His family moved to Cheshire, CT, when he was two years old, and he has been a Connecticut resident ever since. He served in the Navy from 1963 to 1966, first out of Quonset Point, RI, then Norfolk, VA. In 1979 he and his business partner started a commercial drywall company based out of Stamford, CT, called Nutmeg Interiors Inc. Nutmeg employed more than 100 union carpenters and tapers. He retired in 2008 after 29 years in the trade, which has given him more time to enjoy the sport he has grown to love.

FLORIDA STATE SHOOT

Rick Manning broke 198 plus one OT round over two others to capture his first singles championship at the 104th Florida State Shoot held Oct. 9-11 at Silver Dollar SC, Odessa. He also won the all-around, posting 386x400, for his second state title. Andrew Loitz entered 98 to take the main twins outright. Senior vet William Bezubiak claimed the handicap with the lone 97. He previously won the title in 2016. Kay Ohye and Jorge Puignau both carded 663x700 in the high-over-all, with Ohye prevailing in a coin toss for the top prize and Puignau collecting AA.

Matching Manning's score in the 16s, Dennis Kennedy ended in the runnerup spot after the shootoff, and Ohye was senior vet winner. Entering 197 each and shooting off for sub-vet, John Farina was first and Daniel Bandreth second. Also with the same score, Lawrence Walsh took vet honors.

Kate Stone topped Lady I scoring and claimed her first state title. Sarah Jacobs won the Lady II tiara, her second since 2016. Brody Riley defended his junior crown, and first-year shooter Daniel Anthony picked up the sub-junior award.

Mitchel Loveless II smashed 200 for top non-resident.

Trailing Andrew Loitz in the feature doubles, Matthew DeBord (champion for the past two years) netted the runnerup trophy with 95. Carding the same score, Joe Loitz was AA winner. Entering 94 each and securing trophies were Manning, sub-vet; Mark Zauhar, senior vet; and Ohye, senior vet second. Karen Harrington and Kim McKinney were Lady I and Lady II victors. Novice shooter Alexander Formhals won sub-junior.

In non-resident scoring, two entered 98 apiece. Sixteen-year-old Emma Grace Mathews took high gun, and Jacob Duren was junior winner.

Following Bezubiak's 97 in the big handicap, Charles Fleming put up a 95 for runnerup honors. James Cummings (last year's

handicap champion) and Robert C. Thomsen shot 94 each and landed third and fourth after a tie-breaker. Another six won trophies with 94. Bonnie Cobado and Sarah Jacobs collected Lady I and Lady II, while Rick Manning and Scot Lauderback claimed sub-vet one-two. Vets David Muzzey and Donald Keith were age-group first and second.

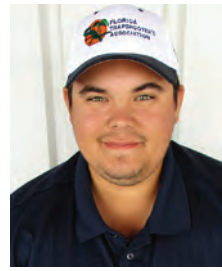

MASSACHUSETTS STATE SHOOT

Nancy Patterson broke 196 and extras to secure the singles title then led residents in the all-around with 378x400, becoming the first woman to win these championships. The Massachusetts State Shoot took place Sept. 3-6 at Minute Man SC, Burlington.

With 95, Matthew Kanavos topped the Handicap Championship, and 2016 winner Robert A. Scott was runnerup with 93. Peter Early and David MacMaster placed third and fourth with 91s, while Dan Grant and Leonard Fauci were the sub-vet and senior vet winners with the same score.

Jacob Pappas posted a 96 in the main doubles to secure the title, with Patterson winning

Lady I for 94, the second-high score among residents. Eight-time champ Robert Nihtila Jr. was event runnerup with 92, and Alan Harrington posted the same score to land the sub-vet prize. Nihtila also paced the high-over-all for the second straight year, this time with 1,044x1,100. That score included a 100 in Thursday's singles, where he won high-gun honors.

Matching Patterson's 196 in Saturday's 16s was Ethan Harrington, and he ended with the runnerup trophy after one extra round. Richard Nihtila, who won the veteran title two years ago, captured the senior vet award this year with 194. Alan Harrington broke 192 to collect his second sub-vet crown; he won the event in 2017. With 191, Michelle Archambeault snared her fourth Lady I crown. She also has four women's tiaras in her collection.

Stanley Froncki topped veterans with 190, while Jacqueline Heller's 183 earned her the Lady II title. Roman Barrett won sub-junior

honors with 181. Jeffrey Lawson Jr. and Stephen Duquette headed junior and junior gold standings with 176 and 175, respectively.

Michael Blaisdell earned top non-resident honors in the singles with 198 and all-around with 383. Leo Henriquez and Jari Mannisto tied at 98 in the doubles, with Henriquez claiming the No. 1 prize after shootoff. He earned top honors in the opening twins with the same score.

Mannisto headed open HOA standings with 1,033. He was winner in Friday's 16s with a century. Jack Redus led out-staters in the main handicap with 94.

Seventy-nine-year-old Leonard Fauci and Ethan Harrington headed Thursday's and Friday's handicaps with 95s. John Federici paced Friday's second doubles event with 98.

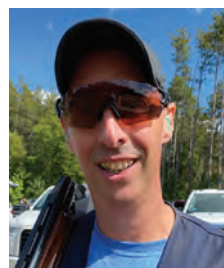

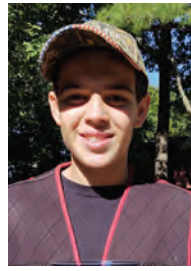

Nancy Patterson

Nancy Patterson was still all smiles when TRAP & FIELD caught up with her to chat about her stellar wins at the Massachusetts State Shoot. According to T&F records, she is the first woman to win the Bay State's singles and all-around championships. Nancy broke 196 plus one round of OT to capture the crown. When asked if she was nervous in the shootoff, she said, "a little, but I stayed focused." She led the 400-target event with 378. She also earned Lady I victories in the main doubles and handicap. She racked up three category trophies in prelim events.

Jubilant and grateful, Nancy said, "I still am trying to believe it. It's been a lot of hard work over the years. There were many times I was just one bird shy of making it in."

Nancy joined the ATA in 2002 but was busy with training her dogs to hunt. Through her association with the American Kennel Club, she shot at the Leominster SA, where she met her husband Jeff, a former Army medic. Jeff urged her to compete, and she

began to register targets in 2011. He continues to support her and is her biggest fan. "My husband was there at the shootoff. He does so much to be there for me and encourage me. He's a great coach, and he is a very wonderful man." Her state shooting resume includes five Lady I singles titles. She has taken Kay Ohye's clinic several times and called to tell him the news of her championship. She thanks Kay for his coaching and for his friendship and support. He has been influential in her shooting career.

Nancy and Jeff belong to Woburn SA, where she competes in a fall league, then begins the "Frozen Pair" league in early December. The couple also belong to Minute Man SC and Westford SC. Nancy uses a Beretta 682 and this year switched to an unsingle barrel and is doing well with it, she noted.

"It was a great experience to win the singles title. A great state shoot. Emotions everywhere! It was a little windy on Saturday, but everything just fell into place," she sighed. "I am incredibly grateful for all the support from family and friends."

SASKATCHEWAN PROVINCIAL SHOOT

Kahl Boll's 98 in the Saskatchewan Doubles Championship led the competition by 11 birds, and he topped the all-around with 362x400, claiming his second title in both, during the provincial shoot held Sept. 25-27. He also paced the high-over-all with 645x700, a 16-bird lead over the field, and won Friday's singles and doubles with 98 and 96.

Keven Mark posted a 92 to secure the handicap crown, and he was runnerup in the feature twins with 87. Others winning trophies with 87 in the doubles were Alick McMillan, A; Tim Kachmarski, C; and John Nuttall,

veteran. Nuttall has won the title over the field four times.

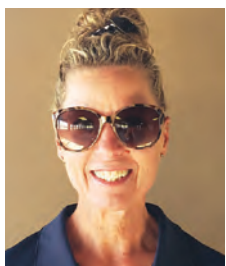

MISSOURI FALL HANDICAP U.S. OPEN

Luke Bussell and James G. Boswell entered lone perfect scores for top singles and doubles honors during the concurrent Missouri Fall Handicap and U.S. Open® tournaments, held Sept. 21-27 at the MTA homegrounds in Linn Creek. The Open was moved to Missouri since the WSRC in Illinois was still not cleared for large gatherings due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Handicap winner with 99 plus 25 in shootoff was Scott Cochran, and he claimed the all-around with 394x400 and forfeit. He also won the opening handicap with 98 then Tuesday's singles and doubles after 100 and 99. Scott collected high-gun awards in two prelim handicaps at the Missouri Fall tournament last year.

HOA victor Keith Ditto totaled 1,183x 1,200, 14 birds ahead of the rest of the field (AAA winner Cochran and junior gold leader Ian Lawrence). The score included 98, 99 and 100 that earned him high-gun honors in both of Thursday's handicaps plus Friday's.

In addition to his 200 in the Singles Championship, Bussell bested 17 others with 100 for top spot in Wednesday's 16s then five others for first-place AAA recognition in Friday's class singles.

A dozen carded 199s Saturday, and 11

In the Handicap Championship, Cochran downed 25 extras to best both Lexi Henning and Jordan Ziercher by one for the high-gun award. The three tangled at 99 in the program, with Lexi taking the sub-junior trophy and Jordan the junior. John Fassino and Marshall landed second and third overall after 98 apiece.

Hunter Spruill, last year's singles winner and Friday handicap high gun, broke 98 to pace Saturday's yardage contest this year. Junior Lex Nielsen broke 98 for the No. 1 handicap trophy Tuesday. Leading Wednesday with 99 was Anthony Schultz.

Grooms and senior vet David Riddle locked

horns at 99 in the opening twins, with Grooms taking first place in carryover. Bruce D. Davis and Luke Bussell ended with the overall winner's and Class AAA prizes after perfect centuries in Wednesday's doubles. Heading the class twins with 99s for category trophies were Christina Byrd, Lady I; Lawrence, junior gold; and Brian C. Smith, veteran.

A total of 661 shooters from 27 states participated.

Scott Cochran

"Shooting at the Missouri Homegrounds brings out the competitive side in me," Scott Cochran told TRAP & FIELD. At the Missouri Fall Handicap/U.S. Open®, he captured the Handicap Championship with 99 from the back fence plus one perfect round over two others, and he claimed the all-around.

A lifelong resident of northwest Indiana, Scott and his brother Steve grew up helping their dad Otis Cochran III at the Griffith Chapter Izaak Walton League gun club. When Scott and his brother finished their duties for the day, they got to shoot some targets. Scott's formal training in trapshooting was his dad standing behind him, giving out tips and pointers. His dad joined the ATA in 1993, and Grandpa Otis shot registered from 1968 to 2011. Scott was 17 when he joined the ATA, and he shot for two years. He played baseball in high school, and life got busy as the cycle of growing goes: school, coaching, work, marriage, and more.

Scott returned to the sport in 2008, but he made clear that his priorities are family and work. He doesn't travel to shoots very much, remaining in the town of Wheaton and competing at clubs around Indiana. His one favorite place to go, however, is the Missouri Homegrounds. He's been attending the Fall Handicap every year with his dad, uncle and other buddies. "Me, dad, Henry [Ray] Seifert, Uncle Willie Cochran and Larry Swentzel shoot together," Scott said. "Others come and go, but we're the main squad." While in Missouri for the tournament, they also golf, fish, and enjoy the Lake of the Ozarks. "I like going to Missouri because it's a fun time, and I like spending time with my dad there or any ATA shoot."

Scott is a steelworker at a mill in East

Chicago in the Hoosier State. His wife Samantha is supportive of his passion for trapshooting. They have two daughters which keep them both plenty busy: Adeline just turned age three, and Isabelle is 10 months.

Scott uses a Perazzi TM1 and shoots mostly Winchester Super Handicap AAs. When asked how often he practices, he laughed and answered, "Pretty much when I shoot registered." He usually tries to shoot once a month with his busy schedule, and he attends his state shoot.

When asked what his most memorable trophy was, he said, "Any trophy I win at the Silver Shoot at the Fulton County GC in Rochester. Some of the best shooters in the state come to compete there. Those trophies mean the most to me because I know I'm shooting against the best." Scott was HOA winner this year. He also added that club owner Don Barker runs a great program and goes out of his way to accommodate everyone.

Scott likes all the people in ATA. "Everywhere I go, it's always a good time." As great as Scott shoots, he didn't have a quick answer about what advice he would give to new competitors. He paused and gave it some thought. "Learn to let things go. And for younger kids, no matter what score you broke, just let today be today." Scott said a lot of wins are unexpected, but he goes to an event with a positive attitude. He tells himself, "I'm going to win everything." If he wins, it feeds his competitive nature. "My year started out well, and it just kept going."

Scott hopes to attend the Grand American one day in the future, but for now it's certain he takes his family and work responsibilities seriously and positively.

Speaking of his competitive nature: he racked up a total of 13 trophies at the fall competition in the "Show Me" State.

Sub-junior Landon Sievers made his way home from the AIM Grand and Grand American with a truckload of new trophies. The 15-year-old from Batchtown, IL, racked up

three awards during the AIM Grand, including sub-junior trophies in the doubles with 97 and all-around with 389. His team, Calhoun Crush, won sub-junior AAA, with Landon's 197 contributing to the win.

Landon went on to Grand American competition and racked up 10 more pieces of hardware. His favorite part of the two weeks he spent at the Missouri homegrounds was the shootoffs. Landon shared with T&F the secret to his shootoff success, "You just have to focus in; that's all it comes down to for me. I just focus and shoot every bird like it's the last bird I'm going to shoot."

Landon joined the ATA in 2015 after a friend introduced him to the sport. He shoots a Browning Cynergy Trap Combo and uses Winchester AAs. His home gun club is Golden Eagle GC, where he practices two to three times a week and participates in trap leagues. Landon's favorite places to shoot are the World S&RC in Sparta, IL, and the Cardinal Center in Marengo, OH.

A member of the Calhoun Crush AIM team since he began trapshooting, one of Landon's favorite things about shooting is when his

team does well as a group and everyone is happy with their scores. Landon told T&F that he likes that the AIM program offers so many opportunities to meet new people. AIM has taught Landon that it does not matter who you are shooting against, young or old, everyone is capable of breaking a winning score.

The best advice Landon has ever received was from his dad, who taught him to make every shell count. Landon's favorite accomplishment is making the 27-yard line this year at the Missouri Fall Handicap/U.S. Open. His advice to new shooters is to practice often and to do the same thing every single shot.

Landon is a sophomore at Calhoun High School, where his favorite subjects are math and science. He enjoys playing basketball, hunting and fishing. Landon's goal is to attend college and shoot at the collegiate level. He would like to thank his coaches Ryan Bland, Chuck Squier, Scott Margherio and Charles Gilman. AIM FOR THE RULES

AIM shooter Rohn called and asked, "Dave, I've been shooting for three years now and have been shooting with the same bunch of shooters all along. All the others have earned yardage, and while I've been shooting fairly well, I am still on the 19-yard line. It's gotten to the point that unless I earn some yardage soon, I'll have to shoot with others for the handicap, and I really don't want to do that. I shoot from longer yardage when we practice, and it really doesn't seem to affect my scores much. Is there anything I can do?"

I thanked Rohn for the call and said, "Many shooters at one time or another in their career face this dilemma. While ATA rules provide that a 19-yarder can shoot between two 21-yard shooters, frequently shoot management is reluctant to allow that much room between short-yardage shooters as a safety issue. You can be assigned longer yardage, up to the 25-yard line, by "shooter request" simply by contacting your ATA Delegate. However, you need to keep in mind that if you do request an increase in yardage, once you get it, you are not eligible for a reduction below the new yardage for a period of two years."

I still get lots of questions about scoring. One young shooter wanted to know if members of a squad could overrule the call of the scorekeeper if they were sure they observed a piece broken for a target called "LOST." ATA rules provide that the scorekeeper may indeed accept the input of shooters but is not required to do so. The ruling of the referee/scorekeeper is final.

* * *

Many clubs and teams are still restricting shooting activity because of the pandemic.

I'm hoping we are going to get past that in the near term, but until we do, I encourage you to continue practicing your gun mounts indoors with your parents' permission and supervision. Keep those shooting muscles in tune so when we can get back to a more normal shooting schedule, you are in shape to do so.

Stay safe and healthy. I hope to see you on the line soon! Keep your head down; remember "Head on the Stock, Eye on the Rock!"

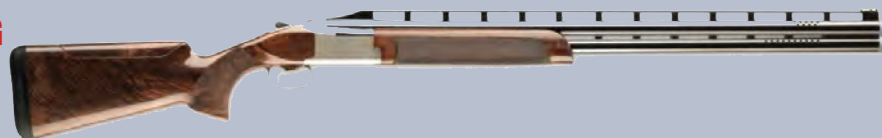

House Rules

Hapless Harry was watching election returns when the phone rang. Grateful for the interruption, Harry was glad to answer the phone. The caller was an old friend and shooter Tad FiveCreeks. After exchanging pleasantries and catching up on family news, Tad said, "Harry, I've got a question for you. As you know, I've cut way back on my shooting the last couple of years as the calendar has been catching up with me. Last week I was downstate for a family gathering and near my in-laws' house is a new club, Two Feathers T&S. So I thought I'd take my gun along and give it a go. Anyway, after the first trap of singles, which went fairly well, one of the other shooters came up to me and said, 'Hey Buddy, you can't load your gun and close the action until it is your turn to shoot. The ATA rules are quite clear on that as a safety issue.' I told him that I'd been shooting ATA since before he was born and I was pretty sure he was wrong. A couple of the other shooters chimed in and we had a rather terse discussion. In order to keep the peace, I told them I wouldn't load and close my action for the rest of the day. I haven't been keeping up with rules changes lately. What is your take on this?"

What is the rule?

Section IV, J, 12 and 14 (Page 16) says:

...

12. A contestant shall place a live shell in his/her gun only when on a post facing the traps. In Singles and Handicap shooting, he/she may place only one (1) live shell in his/her gun at a time and must remove

it or the empty shell(s) before moving from one post to another. In Doubles shooting, he/she may place two (2) live shells in his/her gun at a time and must remove both live or empty shells before moving from one (1) post to another. In changing from one (1) post to another, it is highly recommended that the shooter shall not walk in front of the other competitors.

14. A contestant may hold his/her gun in any position. The contestant must in no manner interfere with other shooters by raising his/her gun to point or otherwise create an observable distraction.

...

Harry read the applicable rules to Tad and said, "As you can see, no rule requires a shooter to keep their action open on the line until it is their turn to shoot. Once on this line and pointing downrange, it is perfectly acceptable to close your action before your turn to shoot—unless the flag or other safety device indicating trap help is downrange and may exit the house is displayed.

"It is common practice for shooters to load and close their guns while shooters ahead of them are shooting, and that is acceptable under ATA rules. Obviously, actions must be empty and open while moving from post to post. Some clubs have imposed further restrictions out of an (over)abundance of caution, but no ATA rules require such action."

Tad laughed and said, "I really was pretty sure that was the case, but I didn't want to stand around and argue for the sake of a singles race. Thanks."

Quick rules facts

A category shooter (Lady I and II, sub-junior, junior, veteran, or senior veteran) who is involved in a shootoff for the category trophy in any shoot when ATA trophies or monies are provided (think state/provincial shoots, Satellite Grands, etc.) who loses the shootoff MAY NOT fall back to place, class, or yardage group.

An age-based category shooter may continue to shoot in whatever category he/she was in at the beginning of the target year, even if he/she has a birthday which would take them out of the category. For example, a sub-junior who turns 15 may continue to shoot as a sub junior, provided he/she does not at any time declare junior. Once declared, such a shooter may not go back to sub-junior.

True or false? 1) If a shooter earns yardage at a shoot, any yardage reduction received thereafter is void.

A: True. The shooter must log the requisite number of targets at the new yardage to receive a review and reduction.

2) A shooter who shoots in another trapshooting organization must shoot the longest yardage assigned, either in the other organization or the ATA.

A: True.

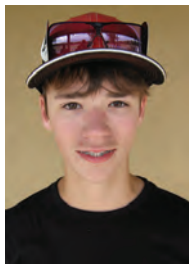

Harley Davis Barr



Harley Davis Barr of Hundred, WV, passed away Sept. 21. He was 84.

He held the state veteran titles in 2001, 2002 and 2003. Known to many as Uncle Harley, he shot in Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia, West Virginia, Florida and the Carolinas. He was a member of the Knob Fork, Marshall County and Tyler gun clubs.

From 1971 through 2012, the ATA life member registered 78,300 singles, 57,600 handicap and 37,900 doubles targets. He worked at numerous state tournaments and held various offices in the trapshooting realm. In 2002 he was inducted into the state trapshooting Hall of Fame.

Mr. Barr joined the Army at age 17, serving seven years. He spent time in Florida, driving a truck and hauling fruit and vegetables. He was a welder at power plants along the Ohio River. He also was an auctioneer and enjoyed playing poker with friends.

"Our family called him 'Brother Barr,' " wrote nephew Weldon Williams. "We loved him dearly. He had a good sense of humor when we would tease him. Every year he was Santa Claus for our children. This was a very special time that we will never forget."

Robert W. Bohringer



Two-time Wisconsin ATA champion Robert W. Bohringer passed away Sept. 18 at his Cassville residence. He was 82.

In 1994 he broke 100 straight to win the Wisconsin doubles championship, and he captured the all-around title with 392. He won numerous additional trophies at the state tournament as well as at Iowa and Minnesota state shoots.

He served on the boards of the Wisconsin Trapshooting Association as well as the Cassville Conservation Club, where he had also been president.

He was a many-time member of the all-state team and held the Wisconsin yearly 27-yard average of .9400 in 1993. In 2000 he was inducted into the state trapshooting Hall of Fame.

Mr. Bohringer was employed at John Deere Dubuque Tractor Works for 30 years, retiring in 1989. He was also a commercial fisherman for many years.

For 30 years he taught hunter safety, and he enjoyed gardening, hunting and fishing.

Among those surviving are Rose, his wife of 60 years, plus two daughters, two sons, 14 grandchildren, 13 great-grandchildren, three

great great-grandchildren, a brother, and many nieces and nephews. He was predeceased by a daughter, a sister, a grandson, a niece and a nephew. Son Richard and brother Keith are also trapshooters.

Elton E. Brown



Elton E. Brown, 1992 Washington Trapshooting Hall of Fame enshrinee, passed away Sept. 10, just a couple of months shy of his 96th birthday.

Elton graduated from Pomeroy High School in 1942 and married Barbara Wallace on Dec. 26, 1945. They made their home at Dayton for a short time before returning to Pomeroy, where they raised four children. Elton farmed in Columbia and Garfield counties until his retirement.

The ATA life member was the cornerstone of the Pomeroy Gun Club for many years. In 1953 he started its Junior Rifle Club, later transformed into the Junior Trapshooting Club, and in which he was involved for over 50 years. He taught hunter safety for many years and two (if not three) generations of youth were taught safe firearm practices from him. His greatest passion in the shooting sports was seeing young men and women become good trapshooters and responsible hunters. His promotion of youth shooting was one of the main factors in his induction into the WSTA Hall of Fame.

Elton started hunting at the age of 10 and bought his first shotgun, a 20-gauge Winchester Model 12, from a pawn shop in Lewiston, ID, for \$22. In 2020 he purchased his 85th Washington hunting license. He hunted in nine states from Alaska to Texas as well as three Canadian provinces, Africa and Argentina.

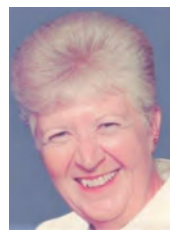
Between 1966 and 1999 Mr. Brown shot at 15,700 singles, 13,450 handicap and 4,300 doubles targets in ATA competition. Later on his farm, he set the Chamberlin Expert trap that his father used to shoot targets. In 1987 he earned two handicap trophies of which he was most proud: a WSTA belt buckle at Endicott after 96 and a 125-bird shootoff, and a trophy for runnerup in the Inland Empire Handicap following a 98.

He started the tradition of having commemorative Remington wildlife calendars created for the annual Pomeroy GC Sausage Shoot; one was given to everyone who entered, and that tradition carries on. He was a life member of the National Rifle Association, Washington State Rifle and Pistol Association and the International Cartridge Collectors Association. He was past president of the Pomeroy Pioneer Association and Pomeroy High School Alumni Association.

Elton is survived by a son, a daughter, 12 grandchildren, and numerous great- and great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by wife Bobbie, a son and a daughter. He leaves behind as well countless folks who he mentored in trapshooting, rifle marksmanship and hunting. He will be greatly missed.

He won trophies in Pennsylvania and Virginia and fired at 36,350 singles, 26,250 handicap and 6,600 doubles during his ATA career.

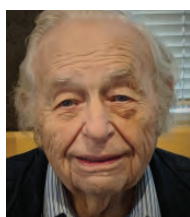
Mr. Eichlin was a telecommunications technician for Century Link in Clinton. Before that, he worked for Sprint for many years.

Marv made several veteran high singles teams while collecting quite a few trophies in that category and was the handicap runnerup with 97 at the Washington State Shoot.

He served three terms as a WSTA director and was treasurer of the organization for several years before his retirement from the board.

An ATA life member, he finished his career with 45,525 singles, 46,600 handicap and 12,050 doubles targets. He was a member of the Odessa, Sprague and Pomeroy gun clubs.

Mr. Greenwalt was a member of Emanuel Lutheran Church in Odessa, the Northwest Basketball Officials' Association and the Odessa Fire Department. He loved gardening and talking to farmers about their crops.

He participated at shoots around Pennsylvania and at his home club, Philipsburg Rod and Gun Club. When that closed, he frequented Tyrone

Sportsmen's Association and Sandy Ridge Sportsmen's Club. The ATA life member shot at 37,450 singles, 7,750 handicap and 1,650 doubles targets during his career.

"The last time Bob was on the firing line was August 2019," wrote wife Sue. "At 16 yards, he broke 47x50. I don't know how he found the strength to shoot that last year, but he mustered up the energy when he got on the line! Guess that shows how much he loved the sport and how determined he was."

He was a member of Cameron County Bucktail Rod and Gun Club, Pennsylvania Rifle and Pistol Association and National Muzzle Loading Rifle Association, and he was a life member of the National Rifle Association.

He enjoyed small-game and deer hunting in the fall and often hiked the woods. He also loved annual visits to the Maine coast and had a cabin in Pennsylvania.

Mr. Nuss received bachelor's, master's and Ph.D degrees in horticulture from Pennsylvania State University. In 1966 he began his professional career there, and in July 2000 he retired as Professor Emeritus of ornamental horticulture.

He was the cooperative extension specialist in the subject and presented talks and educational programs for home gardeners and commercial crop producers across the Commonwealth. He started and was actively involved in the statewide Master Gardener program. Even after retirement, he taught many of the classes for volunteers who went on to assist county extension staff in answering questions related to home horticulture.

Each fall from 1969 to retirement, he taught undergraduate courses ornamental plant materials as well as plant identification.

From 1983 to 2000 he wrote a weekly gardening column *Roots*, which appeared in

newspapers across Pennsylvania and beyond. He also participated in a number of radio and television programs. He served on many department, college and university committees and had numerous professional affiliations.

He and his wife took several extended vacations to the western U.S., visiting many national parks and Native American sites. He hand-crafted traditional leather items used by muzzleloader hunters and other outdoorsmen, which he sold through his craft business, Nuss Lederarbeiten.

Survivors include Suzanne, his wife of 47 years, plus a sister, niece and nephew.

Wendell H. Pawlowski



Wendell H. Pawlowski of Circle, MT, died Aug. 28 as the result of an accident at the local museum, where he was curator. He was 87.

He was instrumental in starting trapshooting at Circle in the mid 1960s and was active in the Circle Rifle Club. The ATA life member fired at a total of 11,700 targets in all three disciplines.

He was born in South Dakota, and his family moved to Montana when he was a young boy. He served in the Army, returning to Circle in 1962 when he began farming and raising sheep.

Mr. Pawlowski was a Montana Hunter Education instructor for more than 30 years, a former volunteer fireman, and active with the McCone County Building Association and the McCone County Museum.

He enjoyed hunting, snowmobiling, auction sales, and following the Chicago Cubs. He was a Little League coach.

He and wife Mary, who survives, would have celebrated their 50th anniversary in December. Survivors include numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.

Arthur S. Thompson Jr.



Arthur S. Thompson Jr. passed away unexpectedly at his home in Alexandria, MN, Sept. 30. He was 75.

He and wife Barb operated the Golden Eagle Trap Range in Alexandria for many years. Between 1986 and 2016, the ATA life member registered 27,300 singles, 25,700 handicap and 17,100 doubles targets.

Mr. Thompson graduated from Alex Tech and in 1965 moved to the Twin Cities and began work as a machinist at World Tool & Aerospace. Returning to Alexandria, he worked for several machining companies before becoming a machine tool technology instructor at Alexandria Technical & Community College.

In his early years, he could be found on the lake, slalom and trick skiing or ski jumping. He enjoyed hunting, fishing and shooting sports his whole life. He was an avid reader of Western novels, historical accounts and crime thrillers.

Survivors include Barbara, his wife of 55 years, plus two sons, one daughter, four grandchildren, a great-grandchild on the way, a sister and two nieces.

George J. (June) Wartsbaugh of Altamonte Springs, FL, passed away Sept. 27 at his home surrounded by family. He was 92.

Between 1966 and 2013, the ATA life member registered 62,200 singles, 100,350 handicap and 68,550 doubles targets, traveling the whole country for many years.

He broke 200 straight for the first time in the 1982 Grand American Clay Target Championship, ending with Class B honors. In the 1977 Doubles Class Championship, he captured a C trophy.

In his trophy collection were the 1995 Midwestern Grand American Handicap Championship runnerup prize plus awards from Ohio, Kentucky and Florida state shoots and the Ohio Mid-American.

He was also a life member of the National Rifle Association, Pheasants Forever, American Legion and Fraternal Order of the Moose. He was a member of the Wright-Patterson AFB club and shot his 100,000th handicap target there, with both daughters and grandchildren present to celebrate the day with him.

A native of Ohio, Mr. Wartsbaugh was a Navy veteran of World War II. Upon his return from military service, he attended Wilmington College. He retired from the state of Ohio after 25 years, and in 1969 he became a farmer. In 1983 he moved to Florida and later retired from the State of Florida Department of Revenue. In 1992 he moved to Nebraska and lived the rest of his life as a snowbird, traveling between there and Florida. He was a member of the Nebraska state trapshooting team.

He was an avid hunter, bowler, and tennis and softball player, and a diehard Yankees fan.

Survivors include two daughters, five grandchildren, two great-grandchildren, a great great-grandson and a nephew. Preceding him in death were previous wife Alma and a sister.

ATA Gun Club Fund grants

Who is eligible?

Any active ATA gun club may be eligible for a grant. Any club that threw registered targets within the current or previous target year is considered active.

What kinds of projects can be funded?

A "project" refers to any type of activity the gun club is doing to try to promote or better ATA registered trapshooting at the club. The club might have a specific program they are trying to begin, such as AIM.

A project also refers to items the club may need to purchase in order for the club to operate more effectively. For instance, the club may need to purchase automatic trap machines, new voice release systems or new traps. The club may also have a need to invest in new computer equipment or software.

How are gun club grant proposals reviewed and decided?

All gun clubs have the opportunity to apply for these grants. Grant request forms (available online at shootata.com or by request from the ATA office, P.O. Box 519, Sparta, IL 62286, 618-449-2224) need to be completed by July 1 each year. The Gun Club Endowment Committee or C3 Committee will evaluate all proposals, and at the Grand American, winners of the grants will be announced. Clubs will be given the money by Sept. 1 (start of the new target year). Then by August 31 of the following year, all clubs must submit an update to keep the ATA and the Endowment Committee informed of how the funding assisted their club.
