
FIGHT AGAINST CANCER

<u>Fees:</u> ATA & MTA fees are paid once per day **MTA target assessment \$2.00 per event.** \$2.00 fifty straight handicap jackpot 50% paid. Lewis Option 2 classes, 60% 40% (ties divide)

Special Lewis Option for this shoot: \$15.00 five dollars of which will be closed to the American Cancer Society.

For those that visit to a domain without playing the option there will be a donation juve; the egistration table 100% will be donated to the American Cancer Society.

Classification – Singles and Doubles: Shooters will be classified according to their known ability and must have their current average card and ATA membership cated with them to enter.


Single: A domain over the content of the American Cancer society and A domain over the content of the American Cancer society.

Handicap will be ATA assigned yardage. Any shooter who shoots in a class or handicap yardage that is higher or lower than that which is assigned will be subject to disqualification and are not eligible for trophies or Lewis purse winnings.

<u>Special Categories:</u> Only Sub-Junior (14 years and under), Junior (15-17 years), Lady (Lady I and Lady II are combined) may be declared. Juniors and Sub-Juniors may shoot at discount prices for targets only and waive the rights to any trophies or purse

Juniors and Sub-Juniors may not play options without permission. These categories must be declared at the time of registration, no changes will be made after the shooter has been cashiered.

New Shooters: Shooters that wish to participate in any event in this program may join the ATA at the time of registration. The ATA annual membership is Twenty dollars (\$20.00). Those shooters will be placed in class "B" for singles, and doubles and placed at the 22 yard line for handicap. New shooters may elect to shoot targets only and shoot from the prescribed ATA yardage per ATA rules. They will not be eligible for



From the east / west: take I-94 to exit 187 Rawsonville Rd go south 10 miles (Rawsonville becomes a dirt road) to Newberg Rd. East on Newberg Rd ½ mile to the club. From the north / south take I-275 to exit 8 Will-Carleton Rd. continue west, Will-Carleton becomes Oakville-Waltz Rd. continue 7 miles on Oakville-Waltz Rd to Timbers Rd, south on Timbers Rd. to Newberg Rd. west on Newberg Rd. to the club.



Frankie Mae Gadson White was a lifetime member of Gamma Phi Delta Sorority Inc., Beta Alpha Chapter. She became a member in 1943. Frankie, an alumnus of Lewis College of Business and one of the original chartered members of Gamma Phi Delta Sorority, signed and filed the article of Incorporation with the State of Michigan. During her tenure, she served on numerous National, Regional and Chapter level offices and committees. She was short in statue but a giant in her love and deeds towards the Sorority.

Dr. Marjorie Elizabeth Harris (December 8, 1924-May 16, 2017)

Dr. Marjorie Elizabeth Harris was a lifetime member of Gamma Phi Delta Sorority Inc., Alpha Chapter the first historical chapter of Gamma Phi Delta Sorority. She was the daughter of Dr. Violet T. Lewis, the co-founder of the Sorority and the President of Lewis College of College. Dr. Marjorie Harris followed in her mother's footsteps and became the President of this historical black college in 1968. She served the Sorority and College with her amazing leadership skills and devotion.
